MC welcome: Craig Henningham – welcomed everyone and made special welcome to the honoured guests.

Toast to Rotary International: PDG Peter Raynor, from his hospital bed thanks to the wonders of modern technology, gave an indepth talk about Rotary International, how and why it was started, and the good that is being done today by over 1.2million volunteers throughout the world.

Response: DG Graeme Hooper, thanked PDG Peter for his words and gave words of thanks and encouragement to our Club and its Members, referring to the "Wheel of Excellence" (the Rotary icon) and how the "wheels of excellence" should keep moving quickly to improve our reach into the community.



Outgoing President's Report: Les Corrigan presented the Club's Report for the 2019-20 year, a summary of the Annual Reports presented in the last "In the Loop" newsletter.

Presentation of Honorary Membership:
Les Corrigan presented an Honorary
Membership to Lyn Thorpe, on her
retirement from Rotary, in gratitude for her
many years of service to Rotary through
many Australian and Overseas projects
relating to the health and wellbeing of
children and mothers through RAWCS and
ROMAC projects, with Days for Girls, and
with Alliance for Smiles. Lyn responded
with thanks and a hint that, sometime in the
future, she may return as an active member

of Rotary – but, in the meantime, if the Club ever needs her help with anything, to call on her. *Thank you, Lyn.*

2020-21 President Induction: DG Graeme formally welcomed Barry Knowles as the 2020-21 President of the Rotary Club of Warners Bay, whilst IPP Les did the honours of handing on the President's Collar to President Barry. DG Graeme commented on this year as a year where Rotary Opens Opportunities — and President Barry may look into alternative ways in which people can become members of, and involved with, Rotary — as an example, through establishing a Satellite Club.

Paul Harris Fellow: IPP Les introduced the recipient of this special award, RN Rob Woolley, in recognition of all the additional work he does, above and beyond the call of duty, within the mherv project, on his travels. DG Graeme gave a short talk about the history of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition and its connection with The Rotary Foundation, and the tremendous amount of good that is done throughout the world because of the donations made to Foundation, enabling Grants to Clubs and Districts for local and global projects.

MC Craig: Thanked and farewelled the Hoopers, as they logged off the RC Warners Bay Changeover Zoom, to log in to the RC Belmont Changeover Zoom.





Guest Speaker: Adrian Payne gave a description of the **mherv** project before introducing RN Rob Woolley to share his experiences.

RN Rob firstly thanked the Club for the honour of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition and felt, for the first time in his life, speechless!

Rob shared several stories, some humorous, some serious, and all about the life-changing life-saving work that comes out of the mherv project. Rotary Clubs around the State have welcomed the mhery project and Rob to their areas. They have hosted Rob and, if there's a Rotary Club meeting on when he's in that town, he attends and shares his mherv story. Since the re-commencement of the mhery project in late 2017, over 7000 people have been tested (not just men, often their wives get tested first to encourage the men to get along & see Rob), 300 lives have been saved and many families have been influenced by the "education" imparted by Rob.

Rob expressed his gratitude to RFBI for their continuous, generous financial support of the **mherv** project, and to ABC Radio National who have helped get the story out to the rural communities around the State.

MC Craig: Thanked RN Rob for sharing some of his stories and for the tremendous amount of great work he does on his travels in addition to his "official" **mherv** duties.

Special Presentation: Craig made a personal presentation, with President Barry's assistance, to Immediate Past President Les, in recognition of the tough year he has had, due to the COVID-19 interruption to "business as usual". Craig explained that the "Rotary Super Hero" pin was developed by Rotarian Evan Burrell as

a fun way to recognise Rotarians and what they've done that others maybe haven't seen, because these Rotarians have been very "Clarke Kent" in their Rotary service. Craig acknowledged that IPP Les wasn't really "into" badges and pins, but asked him to accept this limited edition pin. IPP Les responded with thanks to Craig, and to the Club for supporting and "bearing with" him over the past year.

Introduction of the Incoming Board: President Barry – introduced the incoming Board, firstly thanking IPP Les for the great work he has done over the past year whilst presenting him with his IPP pin.

Thanking and congratulating the Incoming Board members, Barry mentioned that arrangements would be made to formally present their "Badge of Office" over the next few weeks: Treasurer – Christine Johnson-Evans; Secretary – Katrina Henningham; Foundation – Vina Chubb; Membership – Glenda Kociszewski; International Service – Kate Buckingham; Community Service – Kerry Hayes; Club Service – Glenys Tomkins; Vocational Service – Ian Klein; Youth Service – is a Position Vacant; President-Elect – Glenda Kociszewski.

Plans for the Coming Year: President Barry gave his vision for the coming year:

President Barry also wants to see an improvement in membership numbers and engagement, as well as an improvement in Club Finances, to support the administration requirements of the Club as well as to support Rotary projects, and other projects within our Community.

President Barry acknowledged that some of our Club members have been recognised for their skills and talents by the District leadership, and have accepted District roles over the next one to three years. Pres Barry gave his congratulations to those members and acknowledged that they may be "less visible" in Club activities at times, due to their District responsibilites.

President Barry commented that he is hoping that we can return to live, face-to-face meetings as soon as is safe and practicable and is in the process of planning a "Friends Night" with Membership Director Glenda as a way of introducing the great work done through Rotary to our friends, encouraging them to join.

Regarding the charitable focus for the year, President Barry commented that the Club is strongly supporting victims of domestic violence through both the Christmas Trailer Fundraiser (supporting "Survivors R Us") and the East Lake Charity Ride (supporting "Got Your Back Sista").

President Barry congratulated and thanked IPP Les Corrigan and Michael Weatherall (RC Rutherford-Telarah) for the work they have taken on with the **mherv** project.

President Barry stated that, whatever we set to do as a Club, we must have the Capacity, the Energy, the Enthusiasm and the Time – in order to be Successful.

The bottom line to all of this, he said, was we need to have fun and enjoy everything we do in and for the Rotary Club of Warners Bay
