#### 2. Recycling

Tread Lightly: Approximately 110 million shoes are imported into Australia each year, but only about 1% is recycled. Sporting and active lifestyle footwear accounts for approximately 40% of imported footwear, the components of which can take up to 1000 years to decompose. Tread Lightly takes unwanted sport and active lifestyle footwear and recycles it. Rebel and Athlete's Foot stores at Charlestown Square are collection points in our area for the program.

#### From RC Charlestown

#### Beyond the BBQ for Charlestown and Warners Bay

When Covid hit us life changed for Rotarians. Gone was the ability to provide service in crowded spaces. It also impacted on the disadvantaged in our community, many of whom were already doing it tough. However, using the connections that Rotary already had in place, a golden opportunity appeared for the Rotary clubs of Charlestown and Warners Bay.

Oz Harvest was quick to pitch a food hamper project for the disadvantaged to the NSW Government, and a twice weekly packing project at the local PCYC facility, which was in mothballs under Covid restrictions, enabled the delivery of approx. 30,000 food hampers into the local community. In doing so our clubs chalked up over 1300 service hours.

Whilst there were withdrawal symptoms in our ranks from the lack of aromas from sizzling sausages, a new delight of barista made coffee and homemade pastries and cakes contributed by the volunteers on roster made for a pleasurable replacement.

Sadly the funding ceased at the end of January, with the short sighted living with Covid freedom policy, and once again we look for a service avenue. Having been spoilt however, smelly BBQs will remain a distant memory.
