- Opportunities for young people to experience extension programs - sponsoring students to participate in National Youth Science Forum, Science and Engineering Challenge, Youth Exchange.

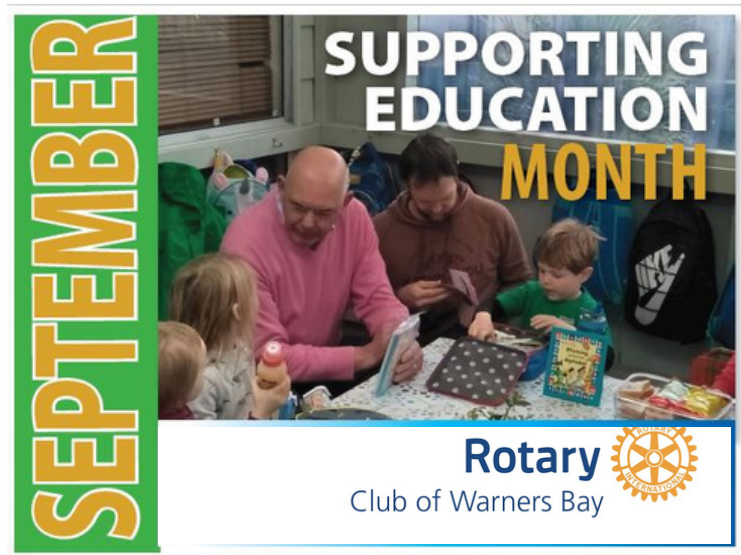
We'll be barbequing at Glendale Bunnings on September 10.

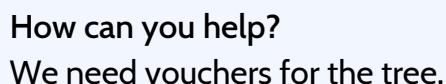

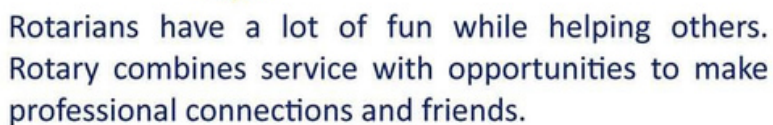

Have got to two critical issues one nearly solved. took 750 ml fluid off my left lung this morning, Smaller amount to come out from right lung.

Reckon will be at least 10days if I can TRAVEL.
