We had many wonderful tributes for Ian and Judy which were passed on to them through our last issue of In the Loop.







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Zoom meeting on Proposed Rotary District 9660 Constitution and Bylaws Transition Chair PDG Steve Hill opened the meeting and introduced PDG Maurie Stack and Patrick Healey to answer questions from the 68 participants.

Key issues raised

1 Election process of Governor Nominee that allows Clubs some say in the process; Currently RI allows a nomination committee or a vote by all clubs. There was some discussion on the need for a small credentials committee to validate nominations.

2 Structure proposed has a Board and an Operations Committee, both chaired by the DG. Bylaws could be changed to allow for AG's to vote for their representatives on this Board. As such, all positions are either Governor executive or roles appointed by DG.

3 DGE Neville will consider what the retained funds for the new District should be, taking into account reserves held for individual programs and new insurance excesses for child molestation offences. He proposed we consider using any excess funds to establish a global grant to undertake projects in the indigenous communities within our enlarged district.

4 DGE Neville announced Patrick Healey as incoming Finance Chair and will work with DGE to prepare a budget for the 2022-23 year.

5 the proposed formation of regional administrative pilots by RI will not impact on the formation of the new District.and potentially will run for 3-5 years commencing 2023-24 year. Final voting on this will occur at club level in May 2022, depending on what position RI Board takes.

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COVID NEWS

Dear Colleagues

Covid 19 has created many challenges for Rotary particularly with cancellations of conferences, and the inability to meet face to face. Technology has enabled training to be delivered, and other important meetings to be held virtually, however the future, and whether we can return to pre-Covid meetings is unknown.

The question being asked is how to address the risk management requirements when we eventually resume face to face meetings and events, and how do we provide a safe environment for members and the public who attend. The expectations of our insurers are that we follow the laws of our respective States and Territories, and practice risk management in accordance with the duty of care owed to our members and the public.

We are aware the DG Group is discussing the best way forward; the Zone Insurance & Protection Committee (ZIPC) and Rotary's Brokers Aon have also discussed this issue following requests from Districts and Clubs. Whilst we have no authority to dictate how clubs should operate, we recommend the following for a safe environment at Rotary meetings and gatherings for your consideration during your deliberations.

- 1. Encourage members to be double vaccinated
- 2. Encourage clubs to implement a QR Code at registration
- 3. Encourage clubs to be "cashless" and conduct financial transactions via Tyro EFTPOS or "Square" device.

We would caution any attempt to mandate, however, we believe the adoption of these measures will demonstrate our response to the effect of Covid 19 in respect to Rotary in Australia.

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
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Dear Club President and Secretary

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CLUB AWARENESS PROJECT


RCWB aim is to enhance the awareness of Rotary in the community.
