Dinner was served from 6:20pm. Barry opened meeting at 7:15pm and welcomed everyone to the new year.

Commented that the new year is a time for renewal and thinking about the year ahead. It has been a sad start to the year for the Rotary family with the passing of Peter Raynor, the epitome of Warners Bay RC. So it is also a time to reflect and remember. Everyone stood for a minute's silence to remember Peter and reflect.

Barry commented that the agenda was short and fairly informal.

Upcoming events:

6/02: Bunnings BBQ (Boolaroo). Vina advised that she had enough volunteers at this time. John and Vina are meeting with Bunnings this week to finalize arrangements. Vina will email members after that meeting and advise requirements and roles. It is acknowledged that the BBQ won't be as profitable as previous ones due to COVID but would nevertheless be a good opportunity to raise some money for the Club. Bunnings are also happy to have us involved as the BBQ's do attract customers.

26/2: Lake Macquarie Council's Australia Day Festival has been cancelled due to COVID.

21/3: Opportunity to run a BBQ at Speers Point Park as part of the "Memory Walk and Jog" event. Volunteers will be needed for this event so put the date in your diary.

Barry commented that the Club doesn't have its own BBQ so organizing one is always an extra hassle. Adrian mentioned that Bunnings at Bennetts Green has a BBQ Trailer that is ready to go but is yet to have the BBQ fitted. He will make enquiries about being able to borrow it.

2021: The year ahead

Attendees were given a sheet of paper and were given 5 minutes to answer 2 questions:

• What do you want to get out of Rotary this year?

• What are you willing to put into Rotary?

Barry commented that the 2 questions are related and referred to the JFK quote: "Ask not what your country can do for you – ask what you can do for your country,"

The answers could be anonymous but the more vocal were invited to share their thoughts. Answers to the first question included social/friendship, community service, every member feeling engaged and connected, members willing to set up a project. Individual answers were collected by Barry.

Question raised about what is happening to the trailer?

The trailer is still in Vina's garage and Vina is not desperate for it to be rehomed. Paul Burchell has offered to find a spot for it in his new storage facility if necessary.

The contents have been sorted and any items at risk of going out of date have been removed (mainly cosmetic items). The value is approx. \$400. It was suggested that these could be used for a Mother's Day raffle at the Autumn Fair.

There is a meeting this week with the Trailer winner who is due to speak at a dinner in March.

Club Storage

A comment was made that we are paying good money for a lot of junk at the moment. There was general agreement that it needs to be sorted and obsolete/unwanted items disposed of. There is also a concern that the container is leaking.

It was agreed that the matter needs to be assessed and an action plan agreed. For discussion at a Board meeting.

Suitability of Seminar Room 2 for dinner/meeting

The objective is to have the meeting and dinner in the one room as the need to relocate is disruptive and a waste of time. However, Seminar Room 2 is less than ideal – too many steps/no lift access and too small to allow proper social distancing for more than 13 attendees. Julie agreed to contact the Club manager to see if a more satisfactory option is available. If dinner and the meeting can be held in the one room, request dinner to be served from 6:30pm (not 6:15pm). Toni McLean offered to bring her sound equipment if this helps.

A word on Branding

This is one of the areas in which Clubs will be audited over the next 12 months. It is important that all Clubs' branded items are complying with RI current branding.

Despite more than a century of Rotarians creating change in communities around the globe, many people don't understand what Rotary is, how we're different, and why they should engage with us. Celebrate our "new" look and feel

How can you help keep Rotary's identity strong?

Around the world, you find the Rotary wheel along roadsides, in parks, and on
