DISTRICT NEWS 9670 - 9660



SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES

District Assembly 15th May 2022

I was very lucky to attend the District 9660 Assembly (or Combined Districts 9670 and 9650 Assembly) held at Kurri Kurri High School on Sunday last week. This was a new experience for me, having never been to a District event like this before. The Assembly was a chance to learn all about what is happening in the new District and a chance to learn about some of the different roles undertaken in a Rotary Club. The highlight of the morning session was an introduction to the Rotary International President Elect, Jennifer Jones, from Canada. Her theme for the 2022 – 2023 Rotary year is "Imagine Rotary" (with a very distinct Indigenous Australian logo), and her priorities are "Diversity Equity Inclusion" (or DEI). These will be the driving force behind all that we do over the coming year.

We were also given an overview of the 2022 – 2023 areas of focus for "D9660" and introduced to the District Management Team. The first District 9660 Conference, to be held next year in Tamworth from 24th to 26th March, will be organised around the slogan: "Lights Rotary Action". Apparently, Tamworth was the first city in Australia to have electric streetlights!

In the afternoon, I was able to attend four different breakout sessions: Membership, Public Image,

Treasurers, and Insurance. There were eight other sessions as well, covering such things such as Youth, Foundation and so on. I picked up a few hints on my role as Membership lead in our club, gained a better understanding of the duties of the Treasurer, found out how insurance is handled by the District Insurance Officer, and learnt about why we need to stick to Rotary International branding guidelines.

So, if you want to find out more about the inner workings of Rotary, I recommend you attend a District Assembly.

Rotary Clubs' community service to assist senior members of their communities

Initiated by Rotary, Probus is a not-for-profit organisation with Clubs in all States and Territories of Australia, New Zealand and 21 other countries. It provides retirees and semi-retirees the opportunity to connect socially, exploring new interests, and maintaining an active role in their communities.

The core goal of Probus Clubs is providing meaningful support to encourage active and enjoyable social participation. By working together, the problems associated with social isolation can be reduced. Older people who are in good health, live in safe communities, have satisfying relationships, and experience meaningful roles in society are likely to be the most socially engaged and to remain contributing members of their local and wider communities for much longer.

Significant benefits can flow to communities by Rotary Clubs supporting or assisting in the formation of new Probus Clubs in their local area to actively assist older Australians to continue and expand their interests, while enjoying the fellowship of new friends and participation in society.

There is an opportunity for retired Rotarians and their partners in addition to their membership of their Rotary Club, to join their local Probus Club, which generally meet for morning tea and guest speaker once a month.

There are benefits for Rotary Clubs who sponsor or have sponsored Probus Clubs in the past, to stay connected with these Clubs. Creating or maintaining a relationship with local Probus Clubs supports the awareness and promotion of Rotary Clubs and may provide opportunities for volunteers for Rotary projects and prospects of attracting Rotarians from families of Probus members.

What could be a more positive and important Rotary community activity than PROBUS, meeting the needs and wellbeing of our treasured older Australians?
