With a global network of 1.2 million members, in more than 34,500 clubs



in over 200 countries, Rotary members meet weekly to plan service activities. Rotary clubs are autonomous and determine their own local needs and the interests of members.

The men and women of Rotary are business and professional leaders who volunteer their time and resources to help others. Club membership represents a cross-section of business professions, and profession is limited from each business classification.

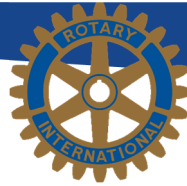
