#### **PRESENTATION**



PP RENEE introduced our guest speaker, Rotarian CHRIS ROMERO, who is active in community outreach, to share with us about "Ending Hunger, Enriching Lives." This outstanding program was fascinating and may create future service opportunities for our club. As always, members needed to be at the meetings to really enjoy the program. Here are a few highlights:

CHRIS is a fellow Rotarian in the Mission Valley Rotary Club. He is currently active in meal packaging for the needy.

He started out in community service by working with AmeriCorps, traveling around the United States doing various service projects. For 12 weeks he and his team worked in Hawaii building trails and restorations. He has also been involved with Kaboom, building playgrounds for kids in a weekend. These types of service projects taught him how to get a lot of people together to perform a short-term service project which greatly impacts others. This led him to meal packaging and the Outreach Program.

The Outreach Program was started in 2004 by a Rotarian in Iowa who saw ways to help out with serious needs in Tanzania. His group focused on clean water, medical care, education, and meals to combat malnutrition. One of the challenges when confronted with hunger is providing quality meals that offer enough protein and vitamins for children. These early meals given to the children included enough food to be sent home for their families. Following success in Tanzania, the question was raised "why not help with food malnutrition and hunger here in the

United States." As a result, 95% of the meal packaging products which Outreach puts together in America today get distributed locally in the U.S communities of need with 5% still being sent to Tanzania.

This expansion of the Outreach Program led to a system of local community projects in which a group of people get together to create a food assembly line event, packaging these meals for the needy. Recently in La Jolla, 30,000 meals for the fire victims in Los Angeles were assembled mainly by Rotarians but the project also included church members and Boy Scouts. This brings people together in a team approach, improving community involvement. With the increase in those needing nutritional help and the reduction in available food at our food banks, feeding folks in need has become more of a challenge lately.

Since 2004, the Outreach Program has packaged over 925,000 meals and they hope to reach 1 million by the end of this year.

This program works with the hosting organization deciding which meal it wants to package and then the group raises the funds required. All the materials needed are then delivered to a specific indoor location for packaging by the hosting group. The food packaged is donated locally, with the hosting organization choosing the beneficiaries. The cost is just forty cents per meal. So with delivery, the supplies to make 10,000 meals is roughly \$4500. It takes about 2 hours for a group of 35 to 50 people to assemble 10,000 meals. After learning about this great program, it raises the question why Oceanside Rotary doesn't participate in this program and package nutritional meals for those in need locally. Hopefully, the board will consider this for a future project.

And with that, PP RENEE presented CHRIS with a beautiful succulent plant by fellow Rotarian ANCHISA FARRANT and a cookie treat from The Hacienda San Luis Rey, thanks to MICHAEL JENKINS.
