
playground opens at 10:30 AM, with a Maximum Score of 4 per player to speed up play for the Challenge.

OCEANSIDE ROTARY GIVES TO THE COMMUNITY

Co – President Elect **PAUL WENDEE** called up **ADRIANNA FURTADO**, who is the **DIRECTOR** of **RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT** for **OPERATION HOPE** – **NORTH COUNTY**, to present her with a \$1,500 check. **ADRIANNA** then shared with us that **OPERATION HOPE** has extended support to over 1,800 individuals, half of whom are children, who are facing the rising cost of housing and living who may be facing homelessness for the



housing and living, who may be facing homelessness for the first time in their lives. Many of these parents and their children are escaping situations of domestic violence. **OPERATION HOPE** can provide temporary housing, and can stabilize the family with a case manager; educate the parent/s to improve their own self-sufficiency; take action to arm them with the skills needed to secure employment and build their independence.



SPEAKER



DAN WILSON introduced our speaker, but started first by saying that "Something has to be really important for me to bring yet another Navy person to this club!" **DAN** shared that he had served 26 years in the Army, and that he has a passion for the topic of providing access to voting for all military

members of our community, as does our speaker, Navy man **JOE FITZGERALD. DAN** shared that **JOE** attended the Naval Academy and has served 11 years in the Navy flying Black Hawk helicopters. **JOE** has continued his public service by currently serving in the Navy Reserves. **JOE** has 2 children under the age of 3, and is busy supporting our country and our democracy by trying to improve and reform our election system by working with **VETERANS FOR ALL VOTERS**, as described hereafter.

DAN and **JOE** stated that they believe that approximately half of all veterans are registered as Independents (a non-partisan politician or person not affiliated with any political party or bureaucratic association), which can eliminate them from voting in many Primary Elections. The United States is well-known for its polarized political system. Every year, it feels like the gap between Democrats and Republicans grows. The two major parties may dominate in elections, but they aren't the only parties you can choose to affiliate yourself with. According to a Gallup survey conducted in January 2024, 45% of Americans identify as an independent voter, 25% identify as Republican, and 27% align with the Democratic Party. Independent Voting, a national communication and organizing center for independents, says

people often become independents when they grow weary of the two-party system, and no longer identify with the strategies or policies of the dominant parties. You are not required to state your political party when you register to vote. Even if you do, you have the freedom to vote outside of your party affiliation in general elections, such as presidential and congressional elections. For example, even if you are registered with another party or as an Independent, in the general election you can still vote for a Democratic candidate. Many independents lean towards one party and end up voting for a candidate from that party, although they may still not agree with the party in general. This offers Independents the opportunity to influence the agendas of the dominant parties.

Political parties use primaries, such as presidential primaries, to choose the candidate who will run on behalf of the party in the general election. Some states (including Florida, Delaware, New Jersey, Oregon, and more) hold closed primary elections. This means that if you are not registered with a party which is represented on the ballot, likely Democrat or Republican, you may not get to vote in the primary and have a say over who moves on to the general election. The good news for Independents is that in some states, the Democratic Party has opened up their primary ballot to Independents.

VETERANS FOR ALL VOTERS is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit with a mission to build and mobilize a community of military veterans to advocate for election innovations that unlock competition, make our politics less polarizing and our government more effective. They say that "We are focused on implementing specific election innovations across the country." The members of **VETERANS FOR ALL VOTERS** believe that our current political environment too often is toxic and focused on extreme partisan rhetoric. The members state that they simply do not engage in this behavior.

"We do not demonize, dehumanize or disown anyone because of their political (or any other) beliefs. We are laser-focused on the three innovations we champion: open primaries, voting innovations and Final-Five Voting." Their mission statement indicates that "We act with urgency because our mission is critical and we say no to everything else. There are no silver bullets or political saviors to quickly fix our dysfunctional, toxic political system. Implementing our targeted election innovations will take time, wisdom and true cross-partisan coalition building. Banding together, from across the

country and across the political spectrum, we do our duty as we understand it.

Having fun while working hard to implement powerful systematic innovations that fundamentally change the incentives in our anticompetitive two-party 'duopoly.'

All while pursuing with the ambitious goal of saving American democracy from the two-party doom loop: partisan extremism, gridlock and dangerous division."

With so many "safe" districts, in 75% of elections, the outcome is determined in the first round of voting—the primary. This means 75% of elected officials in this country are winning office without having to communicate with voters outside their own party. Despite a record turnout in the 2020 election cycle, only 10% of eligible Americans nationwide cast ballots in the primary elections that effectively decided the winners in a supermajority (83%) of Congressional seats.

Final Five Voting describes a new election system consisting of an open primary election to narrow the field down to five candidates for each office followed by a ranked choice runoff general election to determine the majority winner. The first step of this system is to eliminate party primaries. Instead, there is a single preliminary election open to all candidates and all voters regardless of party. Secondly, we would eliminate plurality voting. In the November general election, we can use instant runoffs to sequentially eliminate the lower vote-getters until you get down to the final two candidates, at which point majority wins. To determine the winner, after the ballots are counted:


- 1. The first-choice votes are tallied. If a candidate has 50% or more of the vote at this point, they are named the winner.
- 2. If no candidate has 50% support, the process of instant runoffs begins wherein the candidate who was in last place is eliminated.
- 3. Voters who had ranked the eliminated candidate first in their ranked choice list now have their single vote automatically transferred to their next choice of the remaining candidates.

4. The votes are tallied again. And this runoff process continues until one candidate hits the 50% threshold and is named the winner with a true majority.

Co-President Elect **PAUL WENDEE** thanked **JOE FITZGERALD** for his presentation and indicated that the Rotary Club would be donating a book to the Oceanside Library in his name in thanks for his presentation to our Club.

(JIM SCHRODER forwarded the following photos and captions which he had received from MIKE WESELOH as he described his experience on a tour of various military historic sites.)

- 01 View of landing beach in Guam. (Guam was also ridges, valleys, hills and humid, wet tropical climate.) Once the Marinaras were secured, the Seabees built air bases to allow the forces to reach the Japan mainland.
- 02 Saipan invasion beach. 2nd and 4th Marine Divisions
- 03 Some of the cliffs many Saipan Japanese citizens jumped from to their death to avoid capture by American troops
- 04 The famous Tinian runway which the B29 aircraft took off in atomic bomb missions to Hiroshima and Nagasaki.


Tinian – a very flat island - was taken in 8 days without many casualties. Guam was a different type of battle (more like Saipan) with hills, ridges. Guam would be the first island where the Americans would be faced with civilians. Many native Guam people would be casualties of this operation.

- 05 The battle for Guam was brutal. Japanese were dug in these caves, and ground troops had to take them out one at a time. It took 20 days to secure the island.
- 06 Imagine the damage a Japanese machine gun could do from this position. Peleliu would be an island that did not need to be invaded, but proved to be a brutal and bloody battle.
- 07 Peleliu has artifacts everywhere you go on the island from the battle.
- 08 Caves all over the island. The Japanese soldiers knew that they would die on Peleliu.

09 YIKES!!

10 Sherman tank that drove over a land mine, instantly killing three Marines and a Captain riding on the back of the tank.

11 Massive Japanese ammunition cave.
