

PROGRAM: SHOR introduced our honored guest speaker and District Governor, DON FIPPS, by saying that he is someone who has given his life in service. DON thanked SHOR for her kind words, and then began his remarks by giving a brief history on the tradition of military challenge coins. Sometimes given out when someone is newly assigned to a unit, or often presented by leaders to individuals for their outstanding achievement, the key detail about them is if you have one, you must always carry it with you because if someone challenges you (thus the term challenge coin) to show your coin and you don't have it, you have to buy a round of beverages for everyone present. DON then presented both SHOR and RUDY with his special Rotary challenge coins for their outstanding contributions to Rotary. (Or he could be just spreading his coins around the district so that he can drink for free wherever he goes!)

DON finished his opening remarks by presenting the club with a framed certificate from Rotary International in recognition of our upcoming 100-year anniversary, and hinted strongly that he hoped he would be invited back next April for the big shindig. Like I said, if you get a coin from DON, you better have it on you. I smell an ambush!

DON then introduced us via Powerpoint to Rosebud, a nine-month-old yellow lab puppy that he and DONNA are raising and training to be a service dog. As a dog lover and the owner of my own yellow lab that has stolen a piece of my heart, DON immediately addressed the question that was foremost in my mind, "How do you let go of a dog like that and give it



to someone else?" In response to that question, DON then told the story of the first dog they raised back in 2010, a black Lab named Daphne. He said, while it was hard letting her go, as soon as they saw pictures of Daphne comforting her new companion, who was a teenage boy with Spina Bifida, it made their hearts fill with joy for the part they had been able to play in making that happen. DON then showed pictures of several other dogs they have raised for the organization Canine Companions and remarked how every one of them had gone on to make a difference in someone's life.

Jumping way back in time, DON then told us about growing up in Delano, CA and attending Delano High School. Fun fact that I did not know: Delano is just north of Bakersfield. Anyway, DON told us that he was at a senior assembly one night, not paying much attention to what was going on, when he heard his name called to come forward and be recognized. When he got to the podium, a man from the local

Rotary Club presented him with a scholarship check for \$500, which in today's dollars would equal close to \$3000! Using that money, DON enrolled at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo where he then enrolled in ROTC as the start of a great career in the Army. Also at Cal Poly he participated in the Rose Parade Float Committee where he met his future bride to be, DONNA. The moral of the story? DON said that none of that would have happened without Rotary! Now that's impact!

After retiring from the Army, DON's first civilian job was working for the American Red Cross in Wilkes Barre, PA. DON remembered his leadership asking employees to get involved in local service organizations as a way to increase blood donations, so DON immediately thought of Rotary and joined a local club only to find out that almost every single member of the club was already a blood donor! DON stayed anyway, and like what happens in most Rotary Clubs, he soon made some dear friends and did a lot of cool activities. When the club President left the area, DON was the President Elect and started preparing to assume his duties as President, but before he could, the Red Cross terminated his position and he and DONNA were forced to relocate.

Their next home was in West Sacramento working for a company NOT called the American Red Cross. DON and DONNA soon joined the local Rotary Club, which coincidentally met on Friday afternoons, so DON used the Rotary meetings as a good excuse to not go back to work and thereby start his weekend early! Wow, sounds familiar! DON soon found himself as the editor in chief of the club's weekly newsletter, The Buzzsaw, and did that job faithfully for four years and was in line to be the next President of that club when his employer terminated his position again! Gee, DON, I'm not a smart man, but could it have been all those missed Friday afternoon workdays?

So, fate, or DON's Rotary-enabled habitual long weekend work performance, brought them to San Diego where they have happily resided ever since. After joining the Del Mar club, DON was quickly ratted out by a "friend" about his experience putting together club newsletters, so for another four years he ran the club newsletter for Del Mar. DON soon found himself in line to be President of the club, but not wanting to tempt fate for the third time waited for a few years to fully retire and ensure they weren't going to have to pick up stakes and move again when his club would be counting on him to lead.

Since becoming District Governor, DON has started a committee in the district focused on helping military families, as San Diego County has the largest number of active-duty military members in the country and one of the largest populations

of veterans in California. Knowing our club has several veterans on its rolls, DON mentioned that if anyone would like to get involved in the committee, they could get in touch with him. DON mentioned several organizations which are doing amazing work helping military and veteran families, including Canine Companions, the same organization they are training dogs for, as well as Warrior Warehouse on Camp Pendleton which has helped over 48,000 military families with gently used household goods and other necessities; Workshops for Warriors that provides trade training and certification to veterans; and the Fisher House, which is the military equivalent to Ronald McDonald House.

DON finished his outstanding presentation by announcing an awesome upcoming event, the 2024 District Conference Cruise which will set sail from Los Angeles from 26-29 April 2024. The itinerary will take attendees to Ensenada and back aboard Royal Caribbean's Navigator of the Seas. On this trip, you can have the



opportunity to check out the Thousand Smiles Rotary-sponsored dental clinic, or participate in Rotarians at Work projects in Ensenada, or just explore Ensenada on your own, or stay onboard the ship and relax.
