PROGRAM: PAUL introduced our guest speaker via Zoom, **DAVID CASH**. **DAVID** does a lot of work in international projects for Club Tijuana, who has become great friends and partners on some of our work in Baja California. **DAVID** was hoping to come present in person with **ANA FERNANDEZ** but he suffered a recent knee injury which has severely limited his mobility.

DAVID began by saying that talking about our problems is one of our greatest addictions, and that we all need to spend more time talking about our greatest joys. He said that being a Rotarian makes that easy, and he hoped to describe some of the joy he has gets every day by being a member of Club Tijuana. **DAVID** shared that Club Tijuana would celebrate its 93rd anniversary in October, which is just a few years younger than our own club, and invited us all down for the party and promised to share the details on the upcoming celebration in the near future.



DAVID also mentioned Club Tijuana's Three Kings event, which takes place in January. The Three Kings celebration is a Hispanic tradition that takes place after Christmas. Club Tijuana's event routinely helps over 300 children and families by providing gifts, food and drink, the traditional King cake, and has numerous activities for the kids and their families such as a petting zoo, animation, and a magic show. Past events have seen fourteen different Rotary clubs in four different districts participate, and we're all invited to the next one. DAVID listed off an impressive record of his club's service and contributions to improving the lives in their communities. These accomplishments included: Providing wheelchairs to people of all ages who can't afford their own. Purchasing hearing aids for children. **DAVID** said one of the most rewarding things he's ever seen was being there when a child was able to hear its mother's voice for the first time.

An extensive effort to provide water sanitation to communities in and around Tijuana. **DAVID** took time to recognize our own **DARREL LARSON** for his invaluable participation and assistance in these efforts. **DAVID** mentioned that the average income of many residents of Tijuana is about \$500 a month, and prior to receiving these filters, families had been forced to spend \$50-\$60 of that per month just to buy clean water, and more than 1/3 of people would get sick from drinking unclean water, forcing them to spend more of their limited funds on medical care for their families.

A focus on basic education and literacy that is truly amazing. Club Tijuana partners with their associated Interact and Rotaract clubs, as well as a local university to provide backpacks for local school kids. They have also done extensive work to improve the learning environment at local schools. What started out as simple improvements quickly evolved into major refurbishment when they saw that many schools didn't have adequate roofing or walls in the classrooms. To date, they have repaired and refurbished six schools and are working on refurbishing a community center. They even have a school named after Rotary! One of their clubs most impressive accomplishments is the John Vaughn Scholarship Lab. There, cohorts of 30 students each agree to spend six years of Saturdays devoting themselves to improving their chances of getting a good start at life. Each child receives a Chromebook computer and gets other training and resources to help them succeed, such as participation in a Toastmasters program. Over 90% of their attendees go on to attend university, and the program has produced many skilled professionals, many of whom are now coming back to serve as mentors to the next generations.

As if all that weren't enough, the Tijuana club is also helping to fund a cancer treatment center where the cure rate is over 80%, is working on an app to help caregivers working with autistic children in Spanish speaking areas, and even built a planetarium! This Rotarian was simply blown away by all that Club Tijuana does and has done, and it has only motivated me to try and increase my own impact. What an inspiration! Thank you for that, **DAVID**!

PAUL thanked **DAVID** for a great presentation and reinforced our club's desire to grow our friendship with the Tijuana Rotarians. **PAUL** mentioned that he could also provide a tip for getting your SENTRI card, which makes coming back across the border much quicker, in as little as one day. As our partnership with Club Tijuana grows, keep your ears open for more information!
