
We had some wedding anniversaries to celebrate, too!!

He's the youngest of five kids who grew up in a career Navy family in Clairemont and learned a lot from Mom and Dad about life. He did four

A couple years later he went back to the dentist again and asked for that same \$100 donation and the man's reply was, "Is \$100 enough?. You guys in Rotary do so much!

The Rotary Wheel is the secret to our success. People know our logo, but we are missing opportunities by not wearing our Rotary pin. Rob gave multiple examples of how wearing his Rotary pin has opened up many fruitful and important conversations over the years. Without seeing and commenting on the pin as an icebreaker, those conversations about Rotary simply would not have happened.
