#### **PROGRAM**



CHUCK then introduced our speaker, BUCK RAMSEY, who told us about the Midway Museum in downtown San Diego where he is a docent.

The Midway moved to San Diego in 2004. On Trip Advisor the museum is listed as the 5th most popular museum in the country! The Midway was

commissioned September 10, 1945 and decommissioned in June 1992. It was the flagship for Desert Storm in the Persian Gulf. The museum has set attendance records each year for the last 7-8 years - Last year there were over 1.4 million visitors. They get lots of school kids, and they have expanded classrooms for grades 2-8. These classes give students school credits for attendance. The Midway has electronics labs, and science classes in physics, geometry, and weather.

BUCK graduated from Austin University, joined the Navy and became a supply corps officer. His Vietnam service started in Da Nang in 1969, where he was assigned to Seabee staff. In 1975 the Midway stood off the coast of Vietnam and was part of the rescue of refugees from Saigon. His presentation was about that Saigon rescue and the evacuation from the embassy, an operation called "Operation Frequent Wind". He said that one of the refugees they helped to rescue was a 14 year old girl named Stephanie, who is now also a docent on the Midway!

BUCK showed portions of a very interesting video about that operation and the refugees arriving on the Midway (due to time constraints he was unable to show the video in its entirety, but anyone interested should visit the Midway Museum for more!) He related several vignettes from the video, like the story of two Vietnamese boys trying to get out who were separated from their parents, and

without any ID they wouldn't have been allowed into the embassy to have a chance of being rescued. They grabbed suitcases that had been discarded that had ladies clothes in them, and after searching the suitcases the guards figured they must have been there with their mother so they let them through.

In addition to the Air Force CH-53 heavy-lift helicopters ferrying refugees from the embassy to aircraft carriers off the coast (one of them the Midway), there were also many South Vietnamese UH-1 "Hueys" arriving on the deck also carrying refugees. There were so many helicopters that some of them ended up being dumped off the deck to make more room.

One harrowing incident was when a South Vietnamese officer flew his wife and five kids out to the Midway in a small Cessna airplane. The ship turned into the wind to give him 30 knots of wind-over-the-deck, and he made a deck landing without a tail hook - The ship's crew ran out to help him stop in time to avoid going over the edge of the flight deck. And out came little kids. On the video was the voice of the air boss at the time, and he said it was the most dangerous 30 hours he had ever seen.

BUCK donated two passes to the Midway Museum to the Club. CHUCK said they will be auctioned off next week for Valentine's Day. (Because can you think of a more romantic gift for your Sweetie than a visit to an aircraft carrier?)



CHUCK then presented BUCK with a gift created by TERI Inc. and our very own ANCHISA, with our appreciation for an interesting and informative presentation.

CHUCK then closed the... WAIT! Instead of our standard brass bell closer, it was a Gong by RENEE on the Thai brass Gong! It was at that point that CHUCK realized that he had his replacement gavel nabbed sometime during the meeting! Again! Oh, the Humanity!

CHUCK, not to be deterred, then rang the bell (with a butter knife) to "officially" close the meeting at 1:35.
