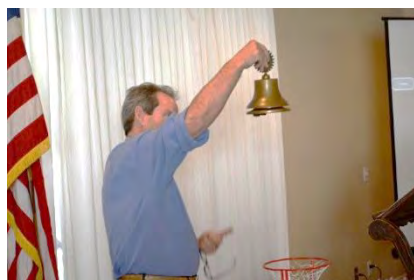

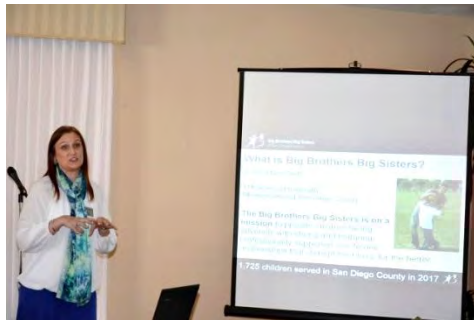


OPPORTUNITY DRAWING

GUEST SPEAKER:



Our program was given by MEGAN HARTWELL with Big Brothers and Big Sisters and specifically Operation Bigs – Mentor a Military Child. Big Brothers Big Sisters of San Diego County's Operation Bigs is a one-to-one mentoring program for military children - the first of its kind in the nation. Mentoring provides an extra layer of support to local military families. The military lifestyle often presents many challenges for children and families such as frequent relocation, school transitions, separation from extended family, increased responsibility coupled with a sense of loss when a parent deploys and the physical and psychological stress faced when a parent returns from war. The program matches military children with "Bigs" who come from many different backgrounds - in the military, retired, or civilian.

San Diego County is home to the largest concentration of military activity in the world with 137,000 active duty military personnel, 230,000 veteran residents, and the largest discharged Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom (OIF/OEF) veteran population in this Nation with about 38,000 recent war veterans (9% of discharged recent warriors). Children in these families have unique needs for support.

In an effort to serve this population more effectively, Big Brothers Big Sisters of San Diego County designed the Operation Bigs program, which provides mentors to children of military families through BOTH the Big Brothers Big Sisters' Site-Based program and the Community-Based program. Since its launch in 2004, Operation Bigs has served more than 1,800 Navy and Marine Corps children at 8 sites throughout San Diego County and has inspired the expansion of this concept to over 30 sites across the country. The need for caring, committed mentors to support the children of those who defend our country remains urgent.

In the Site-Based program, Bigs and Littles typically meet once a week to read together, play sports or computer games, or simply talk about life and personal issues – just as friends do. The Operation Bigs Site-Based program runs at four elementary schools on Camp Pendleton and at sites in Coronado, Point Loma, and Tierrasanta.

North County/Camp Pendleton Operation Bigs program sites:

- Mary Fay Pendleton Elementary
- Santa Margarita Elementary
- Stuart Mesa Elementary
- North Terrace Elementary

San Diego Operation Bigs program sites:

- Silver Strand Elementary, in Coronado
- Gateway Youth Recreation Center, in Point Loma
- Miller Elementary School, Tierrasanta
- Hancock Elementary School, Tierrasanta

After a brief Q&A period, MEGAN was presented with a donation in her name to TERI Inc. and a planter created by some of the people at TERI and filled by our own ANCHISA with succulents from her garden.



With 1:30 approaching, some of us were prepared with our fingers firmly plugged into our ears to try to reduce the damage to our eardrums as President CHUCK aggressively dinged the decibels on the bell to close our meeting, closely followed by the closing gong sound from the back of the room.

“It is with great sadness that I tell you that our friend Estela Gambelin from Parana, Argentina passed away Friday evening from Lung Cancer. She had just been here in Oceanside the week of 20 to 27th of January and prior to that the Training for Governor Elect Convention in San Diego January 14 to the 20th. She fell ill while staying at my house. I took her to the doctors and it was determined she had the pneumonia here. Upon her return to Argentina she went to her doctors and it was diagnosed that she had Lung Cancer. She died less than 3 weeks after being diagnosed. Her kidneys failed Thursday and she passed Friday. I cannot tell you how shocked I am.”

And a note that was added by our Secretary RENEE when she sent an alert to fellow members of Oceanside Rotary:

“She had such a passion for Rotary and her loss is felt here with us as well as with her family and friends in Argentina.”



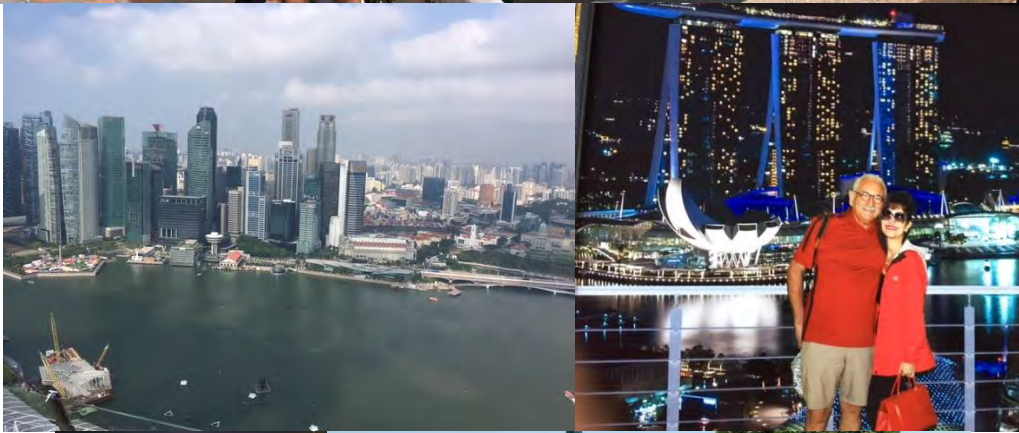
HAPPY NEWS!!! A FIRST BIRTHDAY PARTY!
