speaker.



THOMASINA then introduced new guest **BRANDEN GARCIA**, who came to Rotary for the first time after **THOMASINA** had recruited his

business partner to come to our club, who then recruited **BRANDEN** to visit in his place. **BRANDEN** is a Real Estate agent with Keller-Williams and is a former Marine.

Also, a new visitor as a result of **THOMASINA'S** efforts, was **KEONDRE GRAYSON**, who was a City of Oceanside Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Winner in 2022, who remains a student today, and also affiliated with the organization Thee Loyal Subjectz.



Also introduced as a guest was **RUDY VAN HUNNICK**, who is often assumed to be an ongoing member of the club because he visits us so often. **TERRI AND DAVE HALL**, along with **BILL DERN**, then led us in the Welcome Song.

Announcements:





LARRY HATTER announced that the Youth Committee would be partnering with FRANK ZIMMERMAN, the Head Coach of the men's MiraCosta College Soccer Team, to pick up and transport as many as 6 students from Lincoln Middle School in Oceanside on Friday, September 1, at 1:45, to Mira Costa College for a tour of the college, followed by watching the women's' and men's soccer team matches at MiraCosta that same day, followed by dinner. LARRY needs volunteers to assist in this rewarding annual tour of the school hosted by our Rotary.

Following LARRY, was PABLO ACOSTA, the Executive Director of TRI CITY FOOD PANTRY. PABLO indicated that the food pantry has expanded exponentially and is currently focusing on its participation with the area schools. Presently, they are active in 10 schools in Oceanside and 10 schools in Vista. PABLO explained that kids are coming to school hungry, and if you are hungry, it interferes with your ability to learn. PABLO shared that in their first year, the TRI CITY FOOD PANTRY served 96 families. Their second year, they served 200 families, then the next year 300, and now their goal is to expand their service to up to 600 families! He shared that



their organization was suffering through the inflated cost of groceries, coupled with their need to find storage since their current facility apparently will be torn down in February of next year. **RENEÉ** happily announced that the

OCEANSIDE ROTARY FOUNDATION has just decided to approve a \$3,500 donation for the TRI CITY FOOD PANTRY. Then, BILL DERN asked "was there any minimum size of storage that PABLO required?" To which PABLO responded "No! Even a spare closet would do!" Clearly he was pulling our leg with that answer, and PABLO went on to explain that ideally they would find a minimum of 900 Sq. Ft. that has a restroom for washing hands. Then, to our amazement, our new visitor, attending his first ever Rotary Meeting, BRANDEN GARCIA of KELLER WILLIAMS REALTY, raised his hand and asked

PABLO for his contact information, because **BRANDEN** had just met with someone who had some commercial real estate that might be able to help out. Rotary certainly does work in mysterious ways!

TINA ORTIZ gave \$20 "sad dollars" to indicate that VICKIE PROSSER was not at our meeting because she was attempting to provide comfort to her close friend MAUREEN HARTIN, whose husband JOHN HARTIN, has recently passed away. Us "Oceanside Old Timers" remember how active both JOHN and MAUREEN were in our community years ago. TINA then gave another \$5 for Happy Dollars, sharing that at the Oceanside

Independence Parade, she had mentioned to NANCY RUSSIAN that she was going to be traveling to Sydney and Auckland to be attending this year's Women's World Soccer Tournament taking place in Australia and New Zealand, making it the first-ever co-hosted Women's World Cup. The tournament began on July 20, with the final scheduled for August 20 in Sydney at the Accor Stadium. NANCY told TINA that she had a friend, DEBI HILL, who lives in Auckland, and that TINA should give her a call. TINA did just that, and it resulted in a "telephonic







friendship match" on WhatsApp with **DEBI** offering to act as a personal travel guide for **TINA**, even setting up an itinerary for her stay. **DEBI** is part Maori, which is defined in Wikipedia as: "Māori are the indigenous Polynesian people of mainland New Zealand (Aotearoa). Māori originated with settlers from East Polynesia, who arrived in New Zealand in several waves of canoe voyages between roughly 1320 and 1350. Over several centuries in isolation, these settlers developed their own distinctive culture, whose language, mythology, crafts, and performing arts evolved independently from those of other eastern Polynesian cultures. OUR PROGRAM











the year of 2009 - 2010, **JORDAN** was sponsored by the Bonsall Rotary Club to be an exchange student in the country of Kenya. **JORDAN** later attended the University of Florida and now is an Army Helicopter Pilot being stationed in Washington D.C. flying VIPs from place to place.



JORDAN came forward and shared how he had searched through his mother's garage to find his 2008 El Camino High School yearbook that was passed around for our members to view. JORDAN shared that literally there isn't a day that goes by without experiencing something that makes him think about the time that he spent in Kenya. He shared that his father had been a Rotary exchange student in the Netherlands, and his sister had gone to Belgium, but that JORDAN had selected

Kenya because "they had a really cool flag." (*If you are intrigued, a picture of this Flag is shown below*). At the time of his departure, Kenya was experiencing a great deal of post-election domestic violence, which included tribes killing other members of other tribes. This was of concern, of course, for his family.

When **JORDAN** arrived in Kenya, it turned out that he was the only high school kid that Rotary had ever sent to the Kenya Rotary Club. Not only was **JORDAN** the only Rotarian exchange student in his school, he also was the only "white kid". **JORDAN** shared that when he was at El Camino High School, he was not really engaged in the school activities such as football or baseball or student council. However, upon entering school in Kenya, **JORDAN** was immediately elected President of the school's Student Council, even though he could not speak the language of Swahili. He shared that to travel to his school he had to board "this old school bus without shocks" that rambled over muddy roads that left his village at 3:00 am to arrive at school at 6:00 am. He shared about how impoverished the ghettos were in Kenya with some huts that were made of mud and sticks.

He stayed at his first Kenya home for 3 months, during which time he started to learn the Swahili language. **JORDAN** then moved to his second family home in another part of the country. In this home he attended Mosques on a regular basis and was a visitor at a different Rotary Club. Thereafter, he went to live with a family from India, and started attending Temple with them. He indicated that the Kenya Rotary District Governor purposely moved **JORDAN** around to different parts of Kenya, with different families, to expand the experiences **JORDAN** would encounter during his time in the country. He saw families with wealth and others who lived in abject poverty. When **JORDAN** stayed with one of these families, they introduced him to President Obama's Grandmother. He saw the different tribes of the country, with different practices, languages, and religions.

He confided that when he signed up to be an exchange student that he was not having a "good time" in high school, and just "wanted to get out of California." When he arrived in Kenya, he was treated like a hero. He saw what real poverty looked like, and witnessed racism and sexism at very deep levels. He said that "we take so much for granted in the United States." When he returned from Kenya, he had a sense of "hostility" and experienced some emotional trials, due to a resentment that no one he knew here could really appreciate the need for so much in Kenya. It was so hard for him to know about the deep poverty of Kenya, compared with the wealth of the U.S., and how much we took things for granted. He had gained a different perspective of traveling, and had a sense of wonder about the world. He shared a story about being in an elevator years after his trip, and someone was speaking Swahili, who was amazed when **JORDAN** was able to participate in the conversation.

JORDAN encourages Rotary to engage the youth of our area to show them all that Rotary has to offer. Every day he thinks about the confidence the visit to Kenya gave him in so many different ways, even in communicating "with the ladies." Where he had previously lived an "isolated" lifestyle before Kenya, he became more outgoing after the experience. His real home now is in New Orleans, and he plans on joining that Rotary Club there when his career permits. What he learned in Kenya you "cannot learn in a textbook." Being exposed to such different people and customs, such as waking up to the call for prayer to come to the Mosque, is so completely different than the life he had back home. Sometimes the differences were like "something out of a comedy." The Kenyan people were so open and welcoming. "With one family I was living with, I had been with them for a good deal of time and did not realize that they were vegetarians. Their food was delicious, but I discovered that they were vegetarians when I had brought home some cooked chicken and suddenly the subject was addressed. While I experienced some racism, this helped change me even more. It has been said that 'If everyone was an exchange student there would be no more war.' I realized how judgmental I had been in the U.S. and felt that I now better understood humankind."

During time for questions, **ROGER** asked **JORDAN** to share what it was like for him to be in Kenya when **BARACK OBAMA** was elected President. **JORDAN** said that the President of Kenya held a joyous celebration event for the country, and that so many people would come up to **JORDAN** and give him "high five" hand slaps and handshakes and they acted as though he had something to do with **OBAMA'S** victory, when, he stated, "all I did was mail in my absentee ballot!"



When asked why **JORDAN** joined the Army, he said it was "because I looked so good in the uniform, which matched the color of my eyes." (This had to be hard for his Navy Dad to swallow!) **JORDAN** also added that the Army was his ticket to do what he wanted to, which was to fly helicopters. **NANCY RUSSIAN** urged everyone to see the excellent and multi-award nominated documentary made in 2015 called "Gun Runners" which gives amazing insights into Kenya as it focuses on the country's track stars who have traded in their AK-47s for running shoes. After hearing this input, **JORDAN** smiled and shared how he had been cajoled into entering a couple of track races against a Kenya track team

which **JORDAN** confessed, "I came in dead last both times...which we all knew was gonna happen, and that they just wanted to laugh at me!"

This is the flag of Kenya, that **TOM BRAULT** pulled up on his phone at our meeting and shared with us.





Following **JORDAN'S** WONDERFUL presentation, his Mom, **JACQUE VANDERWERKEN** had the winning raffle ticket for the Opportunity Drawing, but did not pull out the Joker, leaving \$1,000 still in the pot! And, just to prove that this game is on the "up and up", **PREZ SHOR** rifled through the small remainder of the deck of cards to show that, yes, in fact, the Joker was in there.

ROTARIANS OUT AND ABOUT

When we last heard from **TOM** BRAULT about his family's trip to Illinois and Wisconsin for the Oestreich family reunion, they had been greeted in the Northwoods by a beautiful double rainbow shining over the lake. His family's cabin is on the shore of one of the bigger lakes located on a chain of 28 interconnected



lakes. In his Happy Dollars, **TOM** mentioned taking a boat ride, piloted by his cousin, on a beautiful day and here you can see what that looked like.

On a touristy trip to the nearest "big" town (Eagle River – 11 miles away – Population: 1,678), he was pleased to see that the local Rotary club is involved in developing a new community park for the residents there. But the main reason for the trip was to reunite with family and lifelong friends, and the Braults did plenty of that, with lots of opportunities for new baby **BROOKE DERN** to bond with her great grandma (**TOM's** mom **MARTHA**, who spends her summers up north) and multiple gatherings of cousins and neighbors for "Game Night", with **TOM's** team being the big winner of the annual contest.
