## WHO AM I -ROGER VANDERWERKEN

ROGER grew up on a farm in upstate New York where his family raised over 10,000 chickens at a time and sold them door to door in Schenectady NY. ROGER was a Rotary international exchange student to Holland. (He expressed his appreciation to RUDY for his



welcoming countrymen.) He then attended the U.S. Naval Academy and spent time as surface warfare officer, an engineering officer on a guided missile frigate, and a communications officer on a supply ship. He left the Navy and felt the calling to attend a theological seminary. After graduation he rejoined the Navy as a chaplain and spent three tours with the Marines, a tour aboard the USS Ronald Reagan, and he was base chaplain at China Lake. In total he spent 24 years in the Navy and



retired in 2013. After leaving the service, he started the Breakwater Community Church in Oceanside. ROGER joined our club a year ago and ended by letting us know he'll be having surgery next Wednesday and would appreciate our prayers. Brevity in a preacher - who would have thought it?!? He can come back and speak any day, as far as I'm concerned!
