# **PROGRAM**



PP BILL DERN introduced his friend, his massage therapist and our guest speaker ROBERT SHERMAN, CMT. ROBERT started his full-time massage practice in 2001 after a successful career in industrial sales. His keen interest in meditation led him to discover specific massage techniques that allow the body to heal itself.

He has become increasingly interested in helping older adults become free of physical pain and restrictions so that they can live their lives with more freedom and joy.



ROBERT specializes in helping people recover from old injuries so that movement becomes easier and more pain-free. He does this through Ortho-Bionomy, (the gentle bodywork that uses the intelligence of the body to heal itself), Myofacial Release (works with the connective tissue that holds the whole body together) and Trigger Point Therapy

(finding the source of the pain for lasting results). His Senior Massage Care matches older seniors with caring compassionate massage therapists who make weekly visits to the client's residence, be that at their home, their children's home, or board and care or assisted living. He can improve circulation which helps maintain cellular health, increases flexibility, especially in the feet and calves, which can enhance balance, walking and reducing chances of falling.

As with most of our presentations, Rotarians needed to be present to really appreciate it. It was especially true in this case as you missed out on the free massage demonstration and a chance to get a free massage for yourself. Some of the highlights of his presentation were:

ROBERT shared that he is from a Rotary family, his dad being a Rotarian. He pointed out that more than half of the country believes that massage therapy is part of health and medical treatment. Traditional massage techniques relax and stretches the muscles and are enjoyed by many people. If you, however, have an injury like a sore shoulder or back, and go to a traditional massage therapist, you will come out of the massage really relaxed, but your shoulder or back will still hurt. Through some techniques he learned over the years, ROBERT learned to work on the source of the pain, which is not always located where you think it is. For example, a person with severe back pain can have a trigger point in the abdominal area. Massage that area and the back pain is relieved. (Editor's note: As someone with reoccurring back pain, often ROBERT's massage of the abdominal area provides relief of the back pain and tightness.) Dr. Janet G. Travell (White House Physician to President John F. Kennedy and the co-author of medical texts "Trigger Point Therapy Vol. I & II") provided much of the theory behind trigger point therapy.



ROBERT then invited Pres RENEE to receive a neck massage. While providing the massage, ROBERT shared the theory behind his techniques and answered questions. When finished, RENEE noted her neck and shoulders being less stiff. ROBERT also invited

VICKIE PROSSER for a foot massage. One

thing that helps the elderly is foot pumping, which he demonstrated on VICKIE (not that she is elderly). Foot pumping helps with flexibility and can improve circulation in the calves and legs. He also shared the



need for massage therapy for seniors called geriatric massage. The elderly live a very sedentary life, sitting in chairs, watching TV etc. and become very stiff. The gentle message techniques can break down the fascia, leading to more flexibility and improved comfort.



Pres RENEE gave our speaker her traditional thank you gift of a book of thank you quotes, but she probably should have given him a monetary tip for helping to improve her stiff neck!
