

Back in January she had a headache that lasted for two weeks before she finally decided to see a doctor about it. A CT scan revealed a subdural hematoma, which was a truly unexpected result since she had suffered no prior head trauma. She was kept in TriCity Medical Center for three days and followup tests showed the hematoma was 14 mm wide and had caused a brain shift. The doctors, feeling that she



was in generally good health otherwise, decided that this condition might possibly resolve itself, so they planned to just monitor the situation instead of jumping into brain surgery. TINA admits to having been a "terrible patient" and thanks her daughter BRIANNA for all of her help and driving during the last several months. This past Tuesday, another set of tests were done and TINA is happy to say that

there is "no sign of a hematoma anymore! Such a relief, and I feel good!!" In thanksgiving for this great news, TINA gave \$100 to our Oceanside Rotary Club Foundation.

To sum up, RUDY smiled and said "Doctors, medicines, and good friends saved my life!" and that he is glad that he can still be of service to the community. May we all see life from the bright side like RUDY does as we move forward through the years!

RENEE indicated that we should be wrapping up Happy Dollars to get to our speaker, but left the door open for more by asking, "Does anyone else have \$500??" Well, it wasn't 500, but JAY CRAWFORD wanted to add another \$10 in "Happy / Sad" dollars — Sad for the passing of a good friend of Rotary STEVE RIZZO, but happy for the recent trip which JAY and ANITA had taken to Ireland, despite the fact that he caught Covid 7 days into that trip from the tour guide. OUR PROGRAM



Our speaker for the day was invited by Co-President RENEE, but introduced by JANET BLEDSOE LACY. Like we said before, JOHN THILL was a familiar name and face to many of us. Not only was he a Carlsbad Rotarian



himself, but his father JACK spent 52 years of his life as a member of Rotary, including serving as a president of Oceanside Rotary in 1969. Sensing our feelings for his father, JOHN said, "Dad would be so happy to know that he is remembered." Of course, we remember him! JACK

spent more than five decades serving the community in various leadership roles, being involved with Rotary, the Oceanside Junior Chamber of Commerce and Chamber of Commerce, MiraCosta College Foundation, Oceanside Unified's Steering Committee and Board, the USO, Boys Club of Oceanside, Elks Lodge and St. Mary, Star of the Sea Catholic Parish. JOHN, as a graduate of SDSU, proudly followed his father's example and has 24 years of service in Rotary, having been recommended to join by his father when he was in his 20's. JOHN had looked over our list of club leaders and figures that he knew 36 of our past presidents including a memorable PETS experience with our Father Michel (who had actually officiated at his wedding). JOHN has worked for Jazzercise and was an owner of Carlsbad's Personal Strengths Publishing.

JOHN set up his presentation by saying, "It's not Valentine's Day, but I'm here to talk about love." Specifically, he wanted to introduce us to his book "A California Love Story" which he has self-published. It all started when he found the love letters written between his grandparents RAY and DORA WILCOX which had been hidden away in a hatbox. The insights he gleaned from their lives and their love was very meaningful to him, and he decided to borrow a typewriter from Jazzercise so he could transcribe those letters to share them with just his family. As he worked on this project, he was able to organize the letters and tie their story into family research he conducted, including a trip during Covid to Kansas to learn about RAY and DORA's early years.

He described his grandmother DORA as "a sassy female hero", and RAY's letters back home to her when he had relocated to California revealed his passion for both his wife and for the State of California. He arrived in Oceanside in 1925 when the population here was just 200. The community was mostly centered on farm trade and beach visitors then, and was "quite backwards in amenities at the time." RAY managed a Safeway store before going into real estate, starting his own successful company. quickly became a community advocate and organizer out here, and served as Oceanside's mayor for a time in the 1940's. He continued his community work all the way up to his death in 1986.

RAY was appointed to appraise the lands that would become Camp Pendleton in 1942. Are you ready to hear some real estate values from those times gone by which JOHN read off of the original documents his grandfather had prepared? Vail Ranch's 40,793 acres were purchased by the Navy for a mere \$34 per acre, and 2,500 acres of the area surrounding Agua Hedionda went for \$55 each. These stats prompted one bemused listener to comment, "Carlsbad was more expensive than Oceanside, even back then!"

JOHN described his book as a "full circle / non-linear story", wanting to share their story in their own words from their letters while interjecting his own feelings now and then as a narrator. As he was considering writing this book to share with the general public, he received a note of encouragement from noted author VICTOR VILLASENOR, who wrote to him, "We don't know where we are going if we don't know where we came from." RENEE expressed her wish that JOHN simply HAS to write another book to tell a love story of the next generation – that of his parents and our friends JACK and BOBBIE THILL, which was also a special tale.

In the Q&A time, we learned that this book is available on Amazon and/or could be purchased from and signed by the author right on the spot for just \$20. RENEE gave a glowing recommendation, telling us that she had purchased a copy of the book before the meeting and, even though she had only been able to scan about 15 pages of it so far, it already gave her goosebumps reading it. And above his

signature, JOHN had written to her, "To the best

Rotary president I have ever known."

JOHN, in turn, was touched by the lovely parting gift of the potted succulents prepared for him by ANCHISA FARRANT and insisted that she should be in the post-presentation photo alongside him and RENEE.

Two more items of business to take care of before the meeting's end:

- 1) RENEE showed off the beautiful Rotary wheel emblem magnets that could be purchased for \$6 each; and
- 2) Our <u>OPPORTUNITY DRAWING</u> ticket was drawn. Pastor ROGER VANDERWERKEN had the lucky ticket and the chance to draw the Joker to win \$1,000. As he walked forward, RENEE counseled him, "Don't pray first" Apparently, she thought that it might not be fair to get God on his side! ROGER then pulled out one card (which happened to have a "J" on it) and excitedly (and jokingly) asked, "Is that it???" Alas, it was a "Jack", not the "Joker", so the Jackpot remained unclaimed.
