The inspiring Rotary Moment was followed up by Club Updates from the once and future president RENEE RICHARDSON. RENEE informed us that she had recently returned from a District President Elect Training Session (PETS) and was armed with a three-ring binder filled with reams of important papers. Mercifully, the trees were spared, and Renee provided a single piece of paper for the club and told



us to scan the QR form with our cell phone. Dinosaurs such as this week's reporter were informed that we should touch base with one of our younger members if we did not know how to download the QR information.

RENEE did verbally highlight several important pieces of information:

1) DAN WILSON is soliciting 4-pound bags of sugar and small jars of honey to be included in food baskets for the 2500 Afghan refugees being settled in San Diego County. Deadline for donations has been extended to March 27. (Some of the sweet stuff collected at this meeting can be seen in this photo, waiting to be picked up.) We're hoping for 50 more bags of sugar and 50



- more jars of honey to be donated by our generous club members!

  2) SHOR DENNY is hosting a Spring fitness event at Mission Elementary School from 9:15 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on Friday, March 25. Four to five volunteers are needed to help.
- 3) The Rotarians at Work (RAW) day will take place on Saturday, April 30. There will be two opportunities to serve: BRIAN LONG will lead the effort at the Oceanview Cemetery at the corner of Godfrey Street and Coast Highway in South Oceanside. Originally known as the "Oddfellows Cemetery," burials began here in 1895. Many of Oceanside's pioneers are buried here as well as many veterans. RAW day will include general cleanup and resetting of tumbled tombstones. ROGER VANDERWERKEN will lead the work group at Del Rio Elementary School at 5200 N. River Road in Oceanside. This effort involves sprucing up four 4x8 garden plots used for pedagogical purposes. There will also be some light carpentry and landscaping to make the area more handicapped accessible. More information is forthcoming on both projects. Following RAW day, lunch will be served in the courtyard of the Breakwater Community Church, 506 S. Nevada Street.

#### **PROGRAM**

BRIAN LONG introduced CARRIE CHACON to the club. CARRIE is coordinating the volunteer effort for the April 2 Ironman 70.3 event in Oceanside. BRIAN and CARRIE have worked together for many years in Real Estate efforts and in the Oceanside Swim Club. CARRIE has been married for 26 years and recently earned her Real Estate License.





The Ironman 70.3 event, which consists of a 1.2-mile swim, a 56-mile bike ride, and a 13.1-mile run, was first introduced to Oceanside in 2003. In the 19 years since, over \$55 million dollars



have been generated, \$10 million of which have been given back to the community. CARRIE informed us that this year's race offers \$25,000 in grants for volunteer organizations that help with the race. 1,500 volunteers are needed to do such things as man water stations, run

stations, bike stations, pedestrian patrol, and dry clothes pick up. Volunteers are also needed for packet pickups at the Junior Seau Community Center on Thursday, March 31 (10a-7p) and Friday, April 1 (9a-6p). (RENEE RICHARDSON took the lead on signing folks up as volunteers on a Rotary team to help handle these pickups.)

BRIAN pointed out that 2,800 people from all around the world are registered to participate, including 80-100 professional triathletes. The professionals compete for monetary awards and hope to qualify for the Full Ironman competition held in Hawaii in the Fall of the year.

Four of the charities involved are donating proceeds to assist displaced Ukrainian refugees. Some of the better-known charities on site include the Wounded Warrior Foundation, Gold Star families, and the Challenged Athlete foundation.

President AJ apologized to our speaker for not having the traditional gift available for speakers at Rotary Club meetings. He promised to make amends to our presenter CARRIE in the near future.

The **Opportunity Drawing** was won by BRIAN LONG, but our friendly local realtor failed to come up with the Joker and donated the \$10 consolation prize back to the club. The pot continues to grow.

Meeting adjourned on time, at 1:30 p.m. to the somewhat disappointing sound of a measly butter knife striking the bell.


Assemblymember Tasha Boerner Horvath
