


ROTARY CLUB OF OCEANSIDE

ROGER VANDERWERKEN was proud to introduce "his boss" **JACQUE**, his Wife and Life Partner.

DAVID NYDEGGER introduced representatives from **NORTH COUNTY LIFELINE - FRANCISCO FLORES** and **BROOKE STANCE -** who would later be receiving a check from Rotary for their wonderful organization.



EILEEN TURK, of **KOCT,** who we would also hear from later in the meeting, was introduced to the club.

JANET BLEDSOE LACY introduced the guest at her table, **AKINA GOODSON,** who would be our speaker, representing the Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic.

JAY CRAWFORD then led us in the Welcome Song in honor of all of our visitors.

The meeting then reverted back to MADAM PREZ. RENEÉ who invited DAVE HALL to bring up FRANCISCO FLORES and BROOKE STANCE from NORTH COUNTY LIFELINE. DAVE reminded us that amongst all of the good work that is done by LIFELINE, that each year they give their students who are graduating from high school leis which are made out of 50 \$1.00 bills, with help from our ROTARY. FRANCISCO and BROOKE shared that many of their graduating students have been with their organization from as young as 6 years old. LIFELINE provides free in-home parenting services to help families manage stress and improve their quality of life. They ensure that children remain safely in their homes by educating parents and connecting families to community resources. Family support partners provide individual attention, including home

visits, to help the families identify and achieve their goals, and strengthen their families. Other services include information and referral, parent education, and support groups. **FRANCISCO** and **BROOKE** shared a range of areas of work that they do with these kids and their families, many of whom experience a wide variety of challenges. **LIFELINE** can be reached at (760) 726-4900 and is located at 707 Oceanside Blvd, in Oceanside. **BROOKE STANCE** can be reached at (760)419-9836.



The LIFELINE introduction was followed by MADAM PREZ. RENEÉ, CO PREZ. A.J., and DAVE, presenting FRANCISCO and BROOKE with a check from ROTARY for \$750.

This was followed by **EILEEN TURK** of **KOCT**, who shared with us that amongst her volunteer efforts with North County's favorite (and only) local public access television station (shown on COX channels 18 and 19) that she has a show



PROGRAM

JANET BLEDSOE LACY was then called up to introduce our speaker, AKINA GOODSON, who is the CASE MANAGER/OUTREACH COORDINATOR of The Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic at VVSD, Oceanside, 3609 Ocean Ranch Blvd., Suite 120., telephone number (760) 418-4611, agoodson@cohenvvsd.org.



AKINA has an impressive resume, which includes being a client advocate who researches, coordinates, and provides much-needed resources to support and improve client outcomes, so that they can achieve wellness and autonomy. She was also able to share the great services that the Cohen Clinic provides to the wider community. Through outreach initiatives and events, **AKINA** helps to destigmatize seeking mental health services. She holds a Master of Business Administration degree with an emphasis in human resources and a Bachelor of Science in Social Psychology degree, both from Park University.

AKINA has worked with military service members and their families for more than 20 years. (Author's note: **JANET** questioned this representation because **AKINA** looked too young to have done anything for "more than 20 years"!) The daughter of a Marine and a Marine spouse of 20 years, her passion for the betterment of society started at an early age as she began advocating on behalf of the military community, working toward bridging the gap of resources and services. **AKINA** has volunteered as the Director of Programs for a nonprofit called Network for Exceptional Military Families, which helps military service members, their families, veterans and caregivers with exceptional needs. She along

with four other military spouses founded this Network, where she also held positions of Vice President of the Board and Director of Programs. **AKINA** believes knowledge is key and spends time building on her professional and personal development through attending trainings, seminars, and webinars. **AKINA** has been honored as a volunteer of the year, awarded a certificate of recognition in honor of her leadership and dedicated service by the California Legislature Assembly and North County Philanthropy Council, and awarded Armed Forces Insurance Military Spouse of the Year Camp Pendleton in 2018.

The Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic at VVSD is part of Cohen Veterans Network, founded by Steven A. Cohen, who made a \$275 million dollar commitment to launch a network of mental health clinics to serve veterans and families. There are 3 of these clinics in the local area – Oceanside, San Diego, and Torrance - and a total of 24 clinics nationwide. The Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic at VVSD provides confidential, high-quality therapy, and local referral support services to: post-9/11 veterans, service members*, National Guard and Reserves, and their family members, including spouse or partner, children, parents, siblings, caregivers and others. Care is available regardless of discharge status, role while in uniform, or combat experience. Lack of insurance or ability to pay will never be a barrier to care. (*TRICARE referral needed for active duty.)

Mr. Cohen apparently developed an interest in supporting these family clinics after his own son had served in the military, and upon his leaving the service they learned that the resources available to assist in the transition out of the military were found wanting. **AKINA** indicated that many of the issues addressed at the clinics are Post Traumatic Stress Disorder; Substance Abuse; Homelessness and other issues that require an interaction of their clinic acting in partnership with

other resources in our community, and referrals to the same. This includes Rotarian attorney **DAVID SHORE** who specializes in Social Security Disability Benefits, who has helped people successfully file and appeal Social Security Disability claims for decades. Most significantly, he takes on these cases on a "contingency basis", which means that he only gets paid if he is successful in winning his clients' claims. **DAVID** can be reached by calling 760-477-1180, and is located at 4059 Oceanside Blvd., Suit M, in Oceanside.
