Getting Into the Christmas Spirit:



Our president then gave some airtime to LAUREN STEPHENSON who is with the Women's Resource Center. LAUREN told a story of a woman who escaped her abuser and was living in her car with her three children when someone told her she needed to go to the WRC. She went through the 30 day shelter program and

then moved into the transitional facility two year program. During that time, she got her nursing degree and now lives in Carlsbad with her three children and she is doing amazingly well. This year she is planning to bring gifts to the Center's annual Christmas event, bringing her story full circle - Someone going through the program and then giving back to the program.

The Center's holiday Spirit of Giving event is Saturday, December 9th from 9am to 1pm. They normally serve approximately 110 families which equates to approximately 270 children and approximately 1000 gifts are given away. The children get to pick out a gift for their parents and there are volunteers who wrap it

right there! Most of the time the kids are so excited to be giving their parents a gift that they tell them what it is before they even open it. Each family also receives a \$50 gift card so they can buy Christmas dinner to have at home. Ways people can help are by donating toys, gift cards, nonperishable food items, and baked goods to enjoy on the day of the event.

LAUREN gave a special big thank you to Dr. BILL DERN as well as to our Rotary Club for our support. BILL asked if there are any types of gifts that they have been short on over the years for us to focus on? The answer was teenage gifts and gifts for Dads. CHUCK really liked that idea, because our Board had already talked about having our club concentrate on the parents there as a community service project. He added that allowing children the opportunity to give their parent a gift is sometimes more exciting and important than the gifts the kids themselves receive.

Happy Dollars:



TOM BRAULT told a quick story of how touching it was for him to fill in as Santa Claus at the WRC event one year, to see so much joy and sincere thanks on the children's faces. TOM then went on to give \$34 happy dollars to our club foundation and an explanation as to why his hair is short and beard is so

Our Program:



On to introducing our next speakers. LINDA MCLAUGHLIN who works as a volunteer with the Oceanside Fire Department educating people on the hazards of fires and staying safe. One of her favorite places to eat is Hunter Steak House and she has little long haired Dachshund named Lexie. Captain BLAKE DORSE was raised in Oceanside and

has been on the OFD force for 11 years after starting to work with the city as a lifeguard. He loves the carne asada tacos from Anita's and he has a couple kitty cats as part of his family.

LINDA started her presentation by thanking Rotary and making note of how much fun we have as a group! In case anyone didn't know, our lifeguards are part of the fire department - they are all one big happy family at OFD. Oceanside Fire Department receives approximately 21,000 calls per year with 180,000 people living in Oceanside and this number is rapidly growing. LINDA then introduced her little friend, known to most as a smoke detector. The lifespan of most smoke detectors is just 10 years. Once your smoke detector hits its 10th birthday, it will usually make a little noise so please, don't just take it down ... Make sure you replace it! One program the Fire Department offers is to go into a home and replace smoke detectors and bring the home up to code. They perform this service for approximately 20 homes a month. You should have a smoke detector in every bedroom, and anywhere anyone might fall asleep, including your living room!

Next up was Captain BLAKE DORSE who said he would be \$5000 happy but unfortunately didn't bring that much money with him, so he laid a \$20 bill on the podium as Happy Dollars, but not before resident heckler TOM BRAULT quickly mentioned that we do take I.O.U's. BLAKE went on to talk about what it takes to



become a firefighter nowadays. It takes extensive training to become a firefighter -Almost the same amount of time that it takes to get a 4 year college degree. There is a program called Fire Explorers that the Boy Scouts started which allows for an early connection for kids who have an interest in fire service. Some Oceanside statistics and demographics...

- 14% of the population is below the poverty line.
- 25% of the population is below the age of 18.
- 17% are growing up in a single family home.

He married these demographics with his experience with local youth attempting to get the Oceanside Fire Explorer program off the ground. It's a mentorship program offering the kids not just potential career opportunities down the road in fire service, but also it provides insights into citizenship, character development, life skills and leadership. They program is relatively new and they take high school aged kids. They hold a "drill night" every Tuesday night and a mini academy every other Saturday. The mission of the program is to engage, educate and empower Oceanside's youth through positive mentorship towards a career in fire service. There are currently 10 youths in the program with four more coming onboard very soon. They would like to grow it to a total of 25 by next year. The whole goal of the program is NOT to be a summer camp where you write a check and send your kids. They believe that the program should be free to the youth. There are ongoing costs that the city can't accommodate, so any donations are always welcome.

The target age group for Fire Explorers is high schoolers and if the youths stick with the program, they can often end up with a paying job in the fire services by the time they turn 20 or 21. The question was brought up asking if other programs exist which follow this model and whether those programs have seen the youths complete it all the way through and get jobs down the line. The answer is yes: Fallbrook has been doing it since the 1970's and Carlsbad has been doing it for the last 5 years and they each of those programs has seen a very positive turnout of kids progressing into the fire services.



CHUCK thanked BLAKE and LINDA for their knowledge, expertise, and humbleness, stating that we've all grown in knowledge today as a club, thanks to our presenters. CHUCK informed them that we have made a donation to TERI Inc. on their behalf and he presented them with a beautiful hand painted beautiful pot which our very own ANCHISA MARBEN had filled with beautiful succulents from her garden. CHUCK suggested that the pot could be shared between the two of them, and BLAKE wisely said that "LINDA can keep it for the months when it needs to be watered!"
