WHO AM I?



RED BADGER RON MARBEN was asked to come forward and fulfill his last requirement before receiving his blue badge for Oceanside Rotary and tell us a bit more about himself.

RON was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota in 1945. In 1963 he graduated from Edison High School and promptly joined the Navy. He served on three ships during his four year stint – all destroyers. Part of his service was in Vietnam.

In 1967 he started work for Northwest Airlines - first as a mechanic, then a maintenance manager, and finally as an inspection manager. He retired in 2000 after 33 years of service there at the age 55. At this point in his life, he moved to Casa Grande, AZ. Northwest Airlines then hired him as a Quality Assurance Rep to oversee maintenance operations at outside maintenance vendors' locations to check to see that they complied with the proper maintenance procedures. He worked there for about a year.

At that point, he started Silver Hawk Homes in Casa Grande. He built 50 homes and 1 Dollar Store! He permanently retired in 2007.

RON has been very involved with volunteer work since retirement. In 2007 he volunteered with quality management at Casa Grande Regional Medical Center. In 2009 he had his favorite job ever working for the Pinal County Sheriff Posse. That ended when he moved to California in 2010. Since moving to California, he has volunteered at the Agua Hedionda Lagoon Discovery Center.

RON was very thankful to **PP RENEE WENDEE** and his beautiful wife **ANCHISA** for their influence in him becoming a member of Oceanside Rotary. He was active in our club activities and projects even prior to becoming a member!

PROGRAM

PREZ CHUCK then introduced our speaker, author **SCOTT MacDONALD**. **SCOTT** grew up near Chicago and currently resides in Del Mar (where he belongs to the Del Mar Rotary Club). In between, he lived in many places, including Sydney, London, New York, Houston, Philadelphia, Annapolis, Evanston and San Diego! The man gets around!



Prior to graduating from college, **SCOTT** held a variety of jobs, including washing dishes, sweeping streets, telling fortunes and factory work. He learned management from the bottom of the ladder looking up, and eventually took his journey all the way up the ladder to the CEO corner office. He graduated from Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana and the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, NC.

SCOTT has two wonderful sons of whom he is very proud and one perfect (of course!) granddaughter.

He has 40 years of experience working and managing commercial real estate companies, including serving as CEO, President or Managing Director of five companies. He has worked on major projects around the globe and has managed several corporate turnarounds.

Since stepping down as CEO of Investa Property Group in Sydney, **SCOTT** has devoted his time to promoting a student scholarship program, writing, and urban vineyards. He is the proud "parent" of a rescue dog named Sadie (who admittedly rules the roost at his house), and according to **PREZ CHUCK**, **SCOTT** loves the fish tacos at Roberto's!

I came to the conclusion as I was attempting to write down the details of this amazing man's life, there was no way I was up to the task. The intriguing and touching stories he had to tell about the various students that had been affected by the scholarships set up by him and his scholarship foundation were simply amazing. I will attempt to give a few of the highlights (to me!), but this is one speaker that I'm really sorry any of you missed.

His scholarship program was first started at Davidson College because that is where his sons went to school. He wanted to start something that would help the students get an education without putting them under a horrible weight of debt when they finally graduated. His thought was to give scholarships to students and require them to give back to the world in some way either during their schooling, or after that - a community based scholarship. It was an opportunity for the students to "pay it forward".

He received a call from one of the students that had tracked him down that wanted to take him to lunch and talk about her experiences. She had a very tough upbringing. Her father died before she was even born, and her mother, from Switzerland, returned there to give birth to her child. Her mother then developed health problems and needed to move to a warmer climate. She decided on North Carolina and moved there. Because of her mother's health issue the child was eventually placed with an uncle who lived in Australia. The story went on from there, but the gist of it was that she received one of the MacDonald Scholarships and had wanted to give back. She had a friend from Africa who told her there are no schools in Ethiopia in the villages. It would cost just \$5,000 to build a school. The student took it upon herself to gather pictures of children and their stories/poems and write a book. She had the book published and sold copies for \$50 each. She loaded the books in her trunk and sold 100 of them – giving her the \$5,000 to build a school! Problem was, once the school was built, she was told that the school would need more funds so it could keep running – so she printed more books and sold them to keep the school going. Her mother (who has returned to Switzerland and is in a wheelchair) created a website and handles selling the book now, generating funds to keep the school going. All this started with a student still in college!

Another scholarship recipient heard that students in India can't study in the evening because there is no electricity outside of the cities. So he convinced a solar energy company to donate some solar panels and he and some other students rode on three wheeled bikes throughout the villages of India distributing free solar panels to the villagers. Pretty amazing stuff happening through this scholarship program!

These scholarship opportunities are spreading, and are now being given through Indiana University, University of North Carolina, the University of Michigan (just formed 4 months ago and already \$1.2 million dollars have been committed to the program). University of San Diego has been in contact with **SCOTT** also. He committed himself to cover one scholarship for every three scholarships USD arranged and before he knew it, USD had arranged for 12 scholarships! The program has been running for 15 years at Davidson and the alumni indicate these scholarships have "changed their lives". **SCOTT**'s goal is to see this type of scholarship offered at every university so graduates wouldn't have the crushing amount of debt when they graduate, and they also would learn to help others. There are now 60 funded scholarships and he's hoping for 100 within two years.

SCOTT wrote his first book <u>SAVING INVESTA</u> and is working on his second <u>THINK LIKE A DOG</u>. (Definitely one I want to get!) He had a few copies of the first book with him, and donated the entire \$20 price back to our club to do with as we would.



I cannot say enough about how much I enjoyed this talk – and I sincerely wish everyone could have heard this inspiring, big hearted man speak!
