PROGRAM

ROGER VAN VANDERWERKEN introduced our speaker, Florene Villane. She is a Film Professor at Mira Costa College. She specializes in Film Analysis, Film History and roles of Women in Cinema.

She says, "I did not find film, film found me." She was mentored by the late Dr. Robert Porfirio from Yale University and a world-renowned expert in film analysis, specializing in Film Noir. In 2013 she directed an award-winning documentary about a mobster, Michael Franzese, who successfully left the Mafia and went on a mission to help kids at risk. The film "Impact" won Best Documentary at the New York LA Film Festival in 2013.





"Before children speak, they sing. Before they write, they paint. As soon as they stand, they dance. Art is the basis of human expression."

The object of art is not to reproduce reality, but to create a reality of the same intensity. Art is unquestionably one of the purest and highest elements in human happiness. It trains the mind through the eye, and, the eye through the mind. As the sun colors the flowers, so does art color life.

Art is transformative, restorative, healing, humbles, illuminates, and enlightens, ignites the senses to see the unseen.

She cited Rembrandt's "The Prodigal Son." In it, we can better understand forgiveness and compassion.

She said, "I believe how we can give thanks to the divine, however you define that for yourself, is take the time, to own, to "find the art within ourselves" and to celebrate, honor, support art and artists in your community."

Art plays a vital role in your individual districts; Fosters community identity; supports artistic expression; and helps with economic development. Oceanside has been selected by our state government in Sacramento as one of the 14 Designated cities in "cultural diversity".

The Oceanside Arts plan is based on the community's vision, and the community is heavily articulated in the process. The goals and strategies are to support Oceanside Economic Development through arts and culture, and enhance the Oceanside cityscape through creative placemaking.

Several projects in the pipeline are enhancements to the Junior Seau Community Center and the Bandshell, on the beach in Oceanside, which are both in the process. Also being studied are options for the Tremont Transportation Center with parking, housing, and cultural park areas.

One venue which salutes cultural diversity and artistic expression in music and stage plays is our very own Oceanside Theatre Company at the Sunshine Brooks Theater on Coast Highway downtown Oceanside.



Ted Leib came forward to tell us about the history of the Theater. He is also the Artistic Director at the Oceanside Theatre Company. It opened as a movie theater in 1936 as The Margo, was renamed the Towne Theater in the 1950s, and the building was donated to the city in 1993 by its owner, Hattie "Sunshine" Brooks.

The city decided to transform the old movie theater into a performing arts center, leasing it to various organizations to operate. One of the first resident companies was the New Vision Theatre Company.

New Vision ran Sunshine Brooks from January 2005 until 2011. The Oceanside Theatre Company was selected by the City that year to take over the management of the Brooks Theater.

The Oceanside Theatre Company boasts an impressive array of members with strong arts backgrounds.

In a season now they typically try to have 3 plays and one musical with 20 or more actors and production staff.

Also, they have 2 youth programs: One offering a 9-week program teaching theater arts and a Youth Academy which is a 4-week study. These programs focus on

acting and singing and stage presence. Also, Theater set design and costume design.

It has definitely become a "go to place" for an evening's entertainment.
