We were welcomed by Fratelli's owner, BRANDON, and he expressed his appreciation and honor to have us enjoy the evening at his establishment.


PRESIDENT CHUCK then said he was \$20 Happy that everyone was happy to be there.

VICKIE PROSSER was \$5 Happy for an enjoyable family reunion in Oregon of members from all over the world, even though the skies were "smokey."


RUDY VAN HUNNICK was \$40 Happy to be there.
