helping others." After five years with JPMorgan Chase, he is partnering in his own firm with his father (RICK).

He's been in San Diego six and a half years now. He got married in August to a registered nurse at Palomar Medical Center, and they are hoping to start a family. Now, they have a dog.

SEAN has been coaching both boys' and girls' lacrosse teams at Rancho Buena Vista High School, but now he's concentrating on the girls' team only.

"So much is given to us, it's only right to give back to others," SEAN said.





As a result of the peaceful normalization of relations among those countries, CARL said, families now fly back and forth to enjoy vacations.
