A VERY SPECIAL SURPRISE FOR OUR PROGRAM

TERRI HALL prefaced her introduction of our guest speaker by telling us how touched she had been by watching a documentary on veterans' honor flights to Normandy. This experience inspired her to invite CLINT BURKETT – multi-award-winning documentary filmmaker with over 30 years working in television and as a video producer and editor – to give us a presentation. His company Timeline Studios (https://www.timelin3studios.com/) has produced documentaries covering a wide array of subjects, including one on the life story of singer-

songwriter, Steve White, a short documentary about Hawaiians from Maui healing the town of Parkland Florida, a unique perspective on The Holocaust focusing on the Arts as an escape tool, and the special documentary "Freedom Fighter", which he would screen for us today.

CLINT has worked with guest DAPHNE FLETCHER (the publisher and CEO of HPN Books, and filmmaker and founder of LedgeMedia) on several projects in the making. DAPHNE also happens to be the current president of the Encinitas "Animal House" Rotary Club and is publishing a District 5340 Rotary Directory for clubs and members to connect.

After these intro's, CLINT broke the ice by saying, "DAPHNE may be from the 'Animal House' Rotary, but you guys are the 'Fun House'!" The special surprise of today's presentation was that the "Freedom Fighter" documentary he would be showing us is subtitled: "The Story of Willem Van Hunnick and the Dutch Resistance." Yes, this 17-minute film is the story of our dear friend RUDY VAN HUNNICK's father, mostly told through an in-depth interview with RUDY himself. Many of us knew that the Nazis invaded Amersfoort (RUDY's home town in Holland) when he was just 14 years old. But what we may not have known (and which was the foundation of this documentary) is that his

father WILLEM had served in the artillery and cavalry and was a key leader in the Dutch underground resistance during World War II. Among other efforts against the Nazi invasion, the resistance hid, housed, and fed many local Jewish residents so that they would not be captured and transported to concentration camps. Sadly, WILLEM was eventually arrested and tortured to death. Near the end of the video, we were shown how in 2018 the government had placed a granite memorial stone in front of the home where the Van Hunnick family had once lived. It is inscribed: "WILLEM VAN HUNNICK lived here. Murdered in TREYSA on 05/03/1945. 45 years old." In CLINT's opinion, "RUDY and this father are both heroes."









At the conclusion of the film, the club gave both CLINT and RUDY a lengthy and heartfelt standing ovation. With a broad smile, RUDY told us, "I love you all" and marveled that "They even brought me flowers!" And somehow, even through all the planning to pull this special presentation off, this program ended up being a surprise for RUDY. As wife ELIZABETH put it, "TERRI pulled off quite a snow job!" while making sure that he would be in attendance.



CLINT gave us a little insight into the logistics of this film, telling us that RUDY had provided "a handful of photos," but that most of the images and film clips had to be located and the rights to use the footage had to be secured. The film brought back memories for ROGER VANDERWERKEN, who recalled visiting many of the sites shown during his Rotary exchange experience in Holland.



As a small token of our appreciation, CLINT was given a lovely arrangement of succulents crafted by ANCHISA FARRANT before Co-President PAUL

closed the meeting with our **OPPORTUNITY DRAWING**. All of us who were holding losing tickets *almost* got a second chance, as it took ED PARISH quite some time to realize that he had the lucky number in his

possession. But alas, that Joker remains elusive, and ED donated his \$10 consolation prize right back to the club. With the meeting thus concluded, and with no further club business to attend to, we adjourned two minutes early.
