Club Presidents plan and lead meetings, set goals, encourage communications between committees, review expenditures, participate in decisions, and motivate Club members.

You don't have to be a Rotary expert. You can rely on your Past Presidents to train and support you through the process. You just lead the club and tie everything together.

What is the Time commitment? PETS Training in February one weekend. Weekly club meetings, and if you can't attend, you ask a past president to run the meeting.

A lot of the background work is handled for you: The Weekly Agenda is prepared for you. The Board Agenda is prepared for you. Emails are prepared and sent for you upon your request.

PP TOM BRAULT said that, as he was mulling over accepting the job as Prez, he was told that, "The Rotary Club is like a train running smoothly down the tracks, and it will keep barreling along, no matter what you do or don't do." That took a lot of the pressure off in his mind and made him more confident and secure in volunteering to lead the club.


The support that NANCY received from her friends at Oceanside Rotary after the passing of her sister was appreciated very much:
