This Valentine's, we pause to say, Your selfless hearts light up the way!


Visiting Rotarians:

Last Week's Speaker, Deacon Jim Vargas, CEO of Father Joe Village on Homelessness



Deacon Jim Vargas, President and CEO of Father Joe's Villages, let us know that Father Joe's Village, the oldest and largest homeless service in Southern California, is celebrating its **75**th **anniversary** this year.

Deacon Vargas noted that currently over 770,000 individuals experienced homelessness in the United States, and over 270,000 of this number are unsheltered. California accounts for 187,000 homeless

individuals and 123,000 of that number are unsheltered. San Diego sadly counts 10,605 homeless individuals of which two-thirds or 6,610 are unsheltered.

The main reason individuals become homeless is that they can no longer afford the rent on their home or apartment. Many are the elderly.

Though the numbers are daunting, Deacon Vargas and Father Joe's Village, along with several other organizations, are making great strides in providing homes for the homeless. Father Joe's Village currently provides 896 long

term housing units for previously homeless individuals with close to 800 more units in the works.

Deacon Vargas noted that the missions of Rotary International and Father Joe's Village are closely aligned; both organizations work diligently to meet the basic needs of the poor with particular attention to children. Both organizations are dedicated to improving health, with St Joe's additionally addressing our increasing problems of substance abuse and mental illness.

A much-needed detox center with 44 beds is due to open in the spring. Father Joe's Village is primarily funded through philanthropy, and we are all invited to donate to or volunteer for this worthy cause.

President Bob Teaff thanked Deacon Vargas for his presentation and for his dedication to improving the lives of the poor and unfortunate in our community.
