Bob Teaff asked the Club members to think about a situation where the scheduled Club speaker doesn't show up. He asked every member to be prepared to speak for 10 minutes if that occurred.

Last Week's Speaker Bill Hoehn



Bill Burch introduced our speaker **Bill Hoehn**, **President of Hoehn Motors**.

Hoehn spoke of his family's 100-year history in the auto business which his father had inherited in the early 1950's, the golden era of that business. He said that in 1974, his father had offered him \$1500 to come to San Diego and join him in the business, which by 1975 had started to take off in the Carlsbad area.

Hoehn spoke at length about the status and future of electric vehicles. He indicated that the sales of electric vehicles in San Diego

County have been flat for a year and that in Europe, the sales have been flat to declining.

He told us that the average car on U. S. Roads is 13 years old. He questioned whether people would want to spend money on an electric vehicle when President Trump says it's crazy. He also indicated that there are over 100 electric vehicle manufacturers, many of them state owned, in China today and that the Chinese are "way ahead."

Hoehn commented on the topic of vehicle sharing as well. He said that in his opinion vehicle sharing was not going to put car ownership out of business. Finally, he stated his opinion that threatened car tariffs "will hurt everything."

Our meeting was adjourned by President Teaff at 1:30 PM
