Larry served in numerous commands throughout the world during his 22-year career until his retirement in 2015 as a Lieutenant Colonel. Larry served in combat and humanitarian operations and is a recipient of the Bronze Star.

Larry chose to continue his life of service immediately upon his military retirement by joining the **San Diego Police Department w**here he is still an active police officer and served over eight years on our streets. Larry has served as a patrol officer throughout the city, he was a member of the **SWAT** team, a field training officer for new officers, and is currently a **community relations officer**.

Larry knows the city from inside the homeless encampments to city hall and has developed relationships at all levels throughout the city. He has a unique perspective as a leader and lifelong servant who can see the dire need of a new direction to return San Diego to the finest city which it can be again. He is married to Cynthia Turner and together they have two young children.

As an independent, Larry has been able to bring together people who have differing political points of view, yet with the same objective, to make San Diegans proud of their city due to sound decisions that represent the needs of its constituents. Last week's Speaker

Bob Teaff introduced Neil O'Connell, Executive Director of the Mt. Soledad Veterans Association.



Since 2022, **Neil O'Connell** has provided leadership and executive management at the **Mt. Soledad National Veterans Memorial in La Jolla**, which honors veterans from the Revolutionary War and on. O'Connell was a sergeant major in the U.S. Marines, serving 32 years primarily out of the West Coast. He is also a board member of **San Diego Nice Guys**, a

nonprofit that, since 1979, has helped those who have fallen on hard times.

He noted that the Mt. Soledad Memorial was founded in 1954, and, over the ensuing 70 years, has memorialized some 2,000 veterans,

both men and women. Around the cross, walls bearing granite plaques memorialize these veterans, and are maintained by veterans and every 7 years by volunteer contractors. The memorial received over 300,000 visitors/year and in the past six months has held 47 memorial ceremonies in the past six months.
