


The La Jolla Rotary News Bulletin for August 15, 2024

Randy Jones is an All-Time favorite San Diego Padres pitcher and a Charter member of the San Diego Padres Hall of Fame. In his career, the brilliant sinker ball specialist --with superb control -- set numerous baseball pitching records while earning countless awards for his performances. Randy was a fan favorite known for his quick work and once won a game in 1 hour and 31 minutes.

Drafted by the San Diego Padres in 1972

Award, baseball's top pitching accolade while setting Padres' records of 316 innings pitched, with 25 complete games. Randy's achievements were recognized with his selection as **National League starting pitcher in the**

1976 All-Star Game, which he also won. The previous season he was San Diego's first pitcher to appear in an All-Star Game.

In this baseball season, where our beloved Padres are being described as "Sizzling Hot", we are <u>truly fortunate</u> to have someone who is "inside baseball "as our speaker.


Hi-lights from last week's meeting

Youth Services



Youth Services Chair Craig Schniepp described the many activities of his committee. Craig pointed out that he is a third generation La Jolla Rotary Club member. He works with three schools: La Jolla High School which has a very active Interact Club (the high school version of Rotary) with over 100 members; Muirlands Middle School, whose students attend the LEAD program in the fall to learn about Rotary; and he is in the process of helping The Bishop's School start an Interact Club which will partner with La

Jolla High School's Interact Club in some activities. The Clubs participate in multiple home builds in Baja California; each house costs \$8,000 and can house up to 10 people. Remarkably, a house can be assembled on site in a half a day.

Our speakers last Week

Cindy Goodman introduced our speakers, Wendy Moore-Robinson, CEO of S. D. Fire Rescue and Chief John Wood. Assistant Chief the **Operations for San Diego Fire Department.** Chief wood has been with San Diego Fire Department since 1990.

The **San Diego Fire Rescue Foundation** acts as a bridge



between firefighters and the community. It is also a bridge between the City Budget and firefighter needs. For example, the firefighters needed a

Fire hawk Helicopter, which is very expensive. The Foundation assisted in purchasing the helicopter. The foundation also assisted in creating a Health and Safety Wellness Center for first responders, who are at high risk of PTSD.

San Diego Fire Department provides multiple services to the community. All firefighters are at least EMT's, and many are also Paramedics. They can give drugs through shin puncture when veins aren't available. Cameras can spot fires earlier. Lithium-ion batteries can start fires. All Fire Departments in California are integrated, so the public can get better responses to fires. Urban Search and Rescue is run by San Diego Fire Department but is integrated with other Fire Departments in California.

Chief Wood and Wendy Moore-Robinson took questions from the audience.
