Healing Hearts and Minds

October is Mental Health Awareness Month. This month we have invited two distinguished mental health specialists who will discuss working in this challenging field.

We will begin on October 3rd with Dr. Jacob Paulsen.



Dr. Paulsen is a clinical psychologist and the Behavioral Health Program manager at St. Paul's PACE a managed care health plan exclusively for seniors. He will speak about the PACE program generally and will discuss the complex behavioral healthcare needs of seniors, particularly those with severe and acute mental illness. Due to the nature of the population, many patients also present with some combination of severe and

persistent mental illness, general medical problems, chronic health conditions and diseases, as well as complex histories of trauma, drug and alcohol abuse, and various neurocognitive disorders. All this can be compounded by loneliness, a factor in mental health among seniors.

Dr. Paulsen earned his Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, MN. He completed his Doctoral Internship in Clinical Psychology at Sharp Mesa Vista Psychiatric Hospital in San Diego, Calif.
