## At our upcoming meeting October 24th, Scripps Oceanography Scientist Deborah Kilb An expert on Earthquake Preparedness



**Dr. Kilb** will talk about the evolution of thinking about the value of early warning technology and the role the social sciences have played in developing the warning systems currently deployed across the three western states of Washington, Oregon, and California. Dr. Kilb can help us all be better prepared for an earthquake.

Born in Schenectady, New York, **Dr. Kilb** received a B.A. in mathematics and computer science, with a minor in music, from UCSD. She received a master's degree in applied mathematics from UCLA, and a Ph.D. from the University of Memphis, studying at the Center for Earthquake Research and Information (CERI) and specializing in seismology. She served as a graduate intern at the U.S. Geological Survey in Menlo Park, Calif., completed a postdoctoral fellowship at Princeton University, and then joined Scripps, initially as a postdoctoral fellow.
