

Last Week's Speaker(s)

Bill Burch introduced **Dana Churchill**, a holistic health practitioner who runs Churchill Centers in Fullerton and Arcadia. His practice primarily centers on the root causes of disease as well as healthful nutrition. He is actively involved in "**Doctors Against Forced Organ Harvesting**".

Sophia Fang, an engineering student, is actively involved in exposing human rights violations in China.

Forced Organ Transplantation in China

Dana Churchill and **Sophia Fang** took turns talking about both the Falun Gong spiritual practice and the forced organ harvesting in China which primarily involves Falun Gong followers.

What we learned about Falun Gong:

- **Falun Gong's** spiritual tenets center on truth, compassion, and tolerance. They also teach many meditative practices.
- The religion was first taught in public in 1992 with an estimated 100 million followers in 1999. Today there are still an estimated "tens of millions" of followers.
- The Chinese government banned Falun Gong in 1999 and has since persecuted the movement with large scale arrests, torture, and forced organ harvesting.
- Li Hongzhi is the Chinese born founder and leader of Falun Gong. He first lectured publicly about the movement in 1992. Li Hongzhi currently lives in the U.S. Many of his teachings and the tenets of Falun Gong are controversial and differ from traditional Buddhist teachings.
- China's police force and army have reportedly been mobilized against Falun Gong followers.

What we learned about forced organ harvesting involving Falun Gong followers:

- "The Slaughter" by Ethan Gutmann (2014) provides details from interviews with doctors and top-ranking police regarding the immense

- numbers of political prisoners who have forcibly had their organs removed. He estimates that 65,000 over eight years have been killed to support the very profitable Chinese organ transplant business.
- The number of organ transplants in China has gone from 5000/year in 2000 to nearly 20,000/year in 2021. Corneas, livers, and hearts are most often the transplanted organs. Once the organs are removed the patient is killed.
- The Uyghurs, population 12 million, and the Tibetans, population 6-7 million, are also persecuted. Forced labor and harvesting also occurs within these populations.
- Many "harvest centers" and transplant hospitals are located throughout China, and "organ tourism" has become a very lucrative Billion-dollar business.
- The "Falun Gong Protection Act (HR4132/S4914) is being considered by the US congress. The bill would protect U.S. patients from becoming accomplishes to a crime against humanity, protect the U.S. ethics based medical system, and deter and hold China accountable. It was noted that Israel was the first country to pass laws against illegal organ harvesting. Other countries such as Canada and Australia already have similar laws on their books. Marco Rubio from Florida is heading our Legislation.
