La Mesa Nationals Little League



Janet Reade, La Mesa Nationals Little League Secretary and Safety Officer was our guest speaker today. Janet thanked us, on behalf of the Little League, for the barbeque we have put on for 8+ years on opening day. The Little League appreciates what has now become a community event. The La Mesa LL team was founded in 1953 and charted with Little League Baseball, Inc in 1954.

The movie, A Perfect Game, was based on the 1960 final game of the LL World Series in Williamsport. La Mesa played in that game but unfortunately did not come out on the winning side.

This year there are 230 registered players spread across the 5 majors teams, 4 minor teams, 5 Caps, 4 Rookie, and 5 T-ball teams. In addition to the Kuhlken Field, the league plays at 4 fields behind Lemon Ave Elementary School and the one field at Murdock Elementary School. A seniors baseball team plays 3 days a week at Kuhlken Field. The LL annual budget is in the area of \$60,000. The average cost per child

to enroll is \$200 with scholarships available to those in need.

Volunteers are needed for coaching, umpiring, snack bar, score keeping/pitch count or field maintenance.
