The La Mesa Park & Recreation Foundation was established in 1999 with a mission to create exceptional park experiences in all of our 14 community parks.

Misty Thompson, Executive Director of the La Mesa Park and Recreation Foundation, works with a passionate group of volunteers to make La Mesa better. The first project the group took on was the Junior Seau Sports Complex adjacent to the La Mesita Park. This 12.85-acre project offers full lighted ball fields and football. The next major project, entitled Child's Play, had the goal of

replacing play equipment at 5 of the La Mesa Parks between 2010 and 2024. The completion of Collier Park this year saw another successful project finished.

The Foundation also designed and built the Community Garden during the pandemic. For the last 22 years the Foundation has also sponsored the "Sundays at Six" during the summer. Sunday at Six are concerts on Sunday evenings at Harry Griffin Park.

The group annually holds Movies in the Park, Art in the Park, Earth Day Event, and a Park Appreciation Day.


