The Ocean is in a State of Emergency



More than 11 million metric tons of plastic enter the ocean each year, harming marine species and fouling beaches and coastal waters around the world. Most of that waste is carried there by rivers, with the highest flows coming from Asia.

Carl Nettleton, of Open Oceans, told us today that Open Oceans Global aims to stop this stream of plastic from reaching the ocean. Showing the links between the rivers and plastic debris on beaches is a key first step.

Uncontained plastic from five countries contributes nearly 70% of river-borne plastic to the global ocean. Brazil, China, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Philippines. The Pasig River in the Philippines is the worst river for plastic pollution in the world. The Rotary Club of Manila partnered with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources to clean up the Pasig River by donating 395 floating trash barriers to prevent trash from flowing into the river. Nettleton pointed out the need to rethink our approach beginning with the supply chain because we cannot recycle our way out of this situation. If we stop producing plastic today the oceans will continue to have problems for decades.


Blanket & Coat Drive


