If you haven't been to a library in a while, you might be pleasantly surprised by our variety of offerings. Sure, we've got books and knowledgeable staff like always, but we also have movies to borrow, audiobooks, public internet computers, Wi-Fi, downloadable books, research assistance, programs and activities for adults, teens and kids -all for free!Due to COVID-19, there have been some changes to our usual services;read on for more info:

Our library branch is currently open to the public on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. For safety, we are limiting the number of people who can be in at once, and everyone is required to wear a mask and social distance. You arewelcome to browse the shelves, check out items, use the public internet computers, Wi-Fi and print and scan documents. Also, we have tax forms! Our hours on these days is 10am-4pm, with a one hour sanitation break from 12:30pm-1:30pm

On Mondays and Fridays, we have "Doorside Service". Library customers can request books over the phone or internet from the La Mesa branch or other branches. When they are ready for you, you receive a phone call or email. Once you receive that notice you can come to our front door with your library card, and we willcheck-out those items to you.

We also have lots of online services available, with our most popular being downloadable books. You can get free eBooks or downloadable audiobooks sent to your phone, tablet or other device in several ways. You can visit our eBook website at sdcl.overdrive.com and use your existing library card, or easily apply for a digital card. You can choose to select your books on the website, or use the Libby app(free from the Apple or Google Play stores) on your mobile device.
