Camp Julian Oaks

Terry, a Camp Julian Oaks (CJO) and Camp Julian Oaks CJO camper were our speakers on Wednesday. Camp Julian Oaks is a Christian camp that ministers to children who have been abused or neglected. CJO campers are foster children between the ages of 15 and 19. CJO holds 8 weeks of summer camps with 20 students attending for one week at the cost of \$30. The camp has a ratio of 1 counselor for every 2 campers. Campers find it a safe stable environment where they can feel love and learn life skills. Campers are busy from 7 AM to 11 PM each day participating in archery, animal husbandry, horseback riding, skits and singing songs. Other components of the CJO program ae the mentoring program and the benevolent fund. The mentoring program is a dinner at which community residents speak on Getting a Job and Holding a Job, Community College, personal growth and money matters/budget.

Mary, former camper, now a Jr Counselor is being mentored by Terry. Mary is studying Child Development at a Community College.

LMR has been supporting CJO for several years by providing renovations to the camp grounds in the spring, participating in the mentorship program and adopting campers at Christmas. At the conclusion of the talk, we gave them a \$500 donation from our Charitable Giving Fund.
