



Tony Abbot, our Prime Minister, was very well received and extremely popular especially after he disclosed the \$10,000,000 donation towards the Polio Plus program. More than 300 Rotary members, broke two world records on the Harbour Bridge! The climbers set new records for most different flags flown simultaneously (previously 143) and most people ever on the Harbour Bridge (previously 316). In doing so, they also raised over \$108,000 to protect children against the disabling disease polio.

The Opera House and the ferry rides around the Harbour were equally spectacular. The free public transport on the trains and the ferry were good incentives to do a bit of sight seeing around Sydney and no matter where you went, there Rotary name tags to be seen everywhere.
