We were therefore all saddened by the message that Ian and Ann Maree received on Thursday that the CDLC funding was withdrawn by the Government department and it would be compelled to close.

Martin Luther King Jr. once stated "We must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope".

Indeed our infinite hope is that the Government will restore the funding and resources needed to continue with what in Rotary terms is a labour of Service above Self.

Cessnock District Learning Centre



Less Cooper started the CDLC in Cessnock, when he saw the great need by students for such a facility. Less was a member of our club. Today Cessnock District Learning Centre is a community supported organisation designed to meet the needs of "at risk" youth from the Cessnock area. Students are referred to the Centre by local high schools who nominate students experiencing serious behavioural, social, learning and other problems who are in danger of long term suspension.

The Centre accommodates approximately 30 students at any one time with 60 students per year benefiting from the Centre. The Centre has been funded by the State Government for the past 10 years (two full time and two part-time staff).

Our Guest Speakers Ian Scanlon and Ann Maree are behind the success of the CDLC in Cessnock and it has been put up as an example to follow in other parts of NSW. Ian and Ann Maree told us just how successful the program is for students who would otherwise be unable to complete their education and more than likely be a very problematic person in our society. The students are referred to the CDLC when the schools simply can't cope with a students and if they are lucky they end up with a future after all. Ian said "The successful applicant will have tertiary qualifications and/ or significant experiences in teaching students with behaviour difficulties, participating in outdoor education, planning, programming and accountability procedures, and effective communication."

Now the government has decided to cancel any further funding for this very valuable program.


