#### Saturday 25 May 2019 – Open Day at Waratah Men's Shed

Thank you to the small team who manned the "stall" at the Open Day at the Hunter Multicultural Communities Centre. It was important we had a presence to display our ShelterBox and Rotary material, however it was disappointing for the organisers not more people attended throughout the day. Once again, a huge effort from Chris, Grant and Bob for setting up and taking down our display.

#### Monday 27 May 2019 – David Kiernan from Bonsai Association



Our speaker David had an interest in Bonsai from an early age but took it more seriously from 1998. He has been President, tutor and lecturer for the Warners Bay branch.

David spoke about the history – no, Bonsai is not from Japan, it started in China. It was very interesting to learn the philosophy of Bonsai, the tree trunk representing the human torso, the foliage the clouds and how the lower branches should always point down, and the top leaves should appear to bow towards the viewer.

Bonsai should only be a maximum of 1.5 metres and are often described by the experts as "commercial" trees or trees of the enthusiasts. We learned about

the care of the plants with our members asking many questions of David as his presentation proceeded. David explained the type and need for fertilisers, and the ease of re-potting.



The word Bonsai is in two parts, "Bon" meaning true and "Sai" meaning Tray or Pot. They are meant to be outside plants and need the morning sun. They love water but don't like "wet feet"!



Your plant should be watered once or twice a week in winter and every day in summer. It is very much a reflective hobby.

Bonsai is an illusion. The lower branches are wired down to give the illusion of age. Not all Bonsai are 100's of years old as they appear, however most are many decades old before the owners is happy with their presentation.

David had over 150 Bonsai at one point, but now has around 30. One of those plants is a 130 yearold Bougainvillea which he purchased many years ago for \$1,800. He is reluctant to sell it!

It was a most interesting evening, and we were very fortunate that David had several of his Bonsai on display for us at Rotary.

As an additional treat, David spoke briefly about his work in Thailand where he teaches English twice a year ... but that is a story for another day!
