

WHAT IS POLIO?

Fewer than one in 100 infected people get a paralytic form of the disease. When this happens the virus destroys motor neurons, the nerves that control muscles. If polio attacks the brain stem it becomes hard to breathe, swallow, or speak


If polio attacks the spinal cord muscles that were controlled by those nerves atrophy or become paralysed

If polio attacks the limbs usually the legs) they become floppy and lifeless. This is known as acute flaccid paralysis.








Polio Eradication – What have we achieved ?




- 3 Billion Children vaccinated.





Circulating Vaccine Derived Polio Virus (cVDPV) as at March 14, 2022.




If a population is seriously under-immunized, there are enough susceptible children for the excreted vaccine-derived polioviruses to begin circulating in the community. If the vaccine-virus is able to circulate for a prolonged period uninterrupted, it can mutate and, over the course of 12-18 months, reacquire neurovirulence. These viruses are called circulating vaccine-derived polioviruses (cVDPV).

First Polio Case in Nearly a Decade Is Detected in New York State

A man who lives in Rockland County was infected by someone who received the oral polio vaccine, which is no longer used in the United States, officials said.

A case of polio has been identified in an unvaccinated adult man in Rockland County, officials said.

The New York State Department of Health and its Rockland County counterpart confirmed that the infection was transmitted from someone who received the oral polio vaccine, which has not been administered in the United States since 2000. Officials said in a news release that the virus may have originated outside the United States, where the oral vaccine is still administered.

Goal one:

Permanently interrupt transmission of all poliovirus in Afghanistan and Pakistan by end of 2023. Certification by end of 2026.

Goal two:

Stop transmission of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 by end of 2023 and prevent outbreaks in polio-free regions.

\$^{US} 4.8 billion needed over 5 years to achieve these goals

3000 international scientists, physicians, and public health experts have endorsed the GPEI 2022-2026 Strategy and called on donors to stay committed. (*World Health Summit, October 2022*)

ERADICATING POLIO – THE CHALLENGES

- Persisting pockets of missed children in conflict countries and geographically remote areas.
- Rise of circulating vaccine derived polio (cVDP) in regions of low immunization
- Spread of misinformation
 - e.g. CIA poisoning children False purple pinkies
- Maintaining political commitment.
 e.g Election year in Pakistan

Threats to polio workers

- e.g. Physical attacks / shootings Restrictions on dress & work for females in Afghanistan Floods in Pakistan impacted 12,500 polio workers
- Securing financial resources

i.e. USD 2.5 billion needed to finish the job



ERADICATING POLIO – THE GOOD NEWS

- Zero wild polio virus cases since 15 September 2022.
- Geographical restriction of WPV transmission to eastern Afghanistan and a few districts of northwestern Pakistan.
- Genetic strains of WPV have dropped from thirteen to just a single lineage in each endemic country over the past year.
- Introduction of Novel Oral Polio Vaccine (nOPV2) is reducing the likelihood of circulating vaccine derived polio (cVDPV) outbreaks
- Gender initiatives improving immunization rates
- National governments & other agencies are providing financial support








What is the PolioPlus Society?


- PolioPlus Society (PPS) encourages Rotarians to commit to a minimum of \$^{US}100 per year to the PolioPlus Fund until polio is eradicated completely.
- Society members receive a special PPS pin, and certificate.
- Administered by District PolioPlus Chairs, or their designates.
