## Bunnings BBQ's

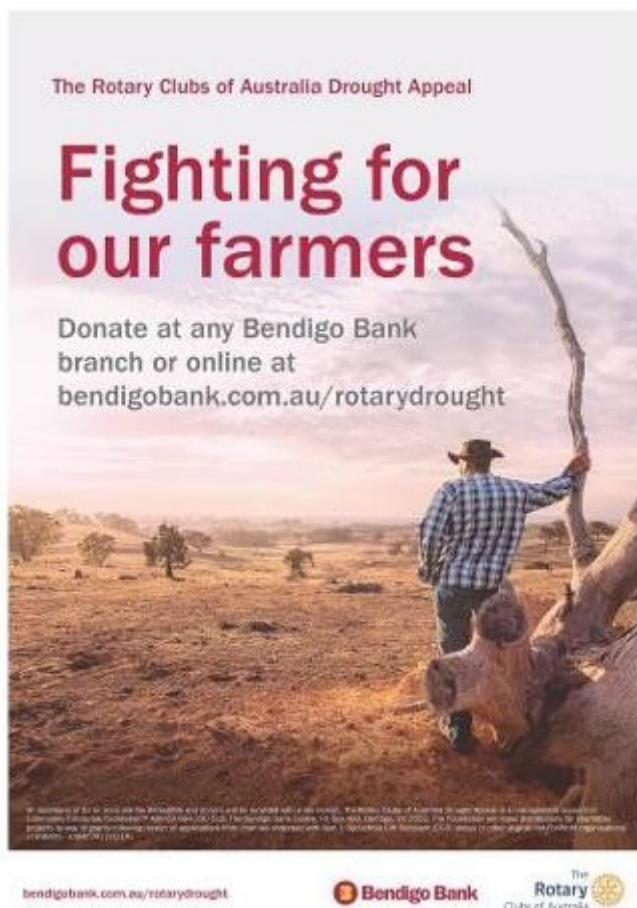
Our Bunnings BBQ's have continued to be a great success this year.

## What is the Rotary Leadership Institute

The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) is a multi-district, grassroots leadership development program of member districts organized into regional divisions throughout the world.

The RLI seeks to have Rotary Clubs in member districts identify those Rotarians who seem to have the POTENTIAL for future club leadership (not necessarily as club presidents) and provide those so identified with a quality education in Rotary knowledge and leadership skills for voluntary organizations.

### RLI PHILOSOPHY

"Having leadership skills does not alone assure good Rotary leadership. An effective Rotary leader must ALSO have Rotary knowledge, perspective about where Rotary has been, where it is now and a vision of what Rotary can be."

The program consists of three parts which will be held at the District Office in Sefton Road, Thornleigh. Each session will start 8:30 for 9:00 a.m. and should be completed around 3:45 pm. Participants will be supplied with the course materials, morning tea and lunch.  
*The course costs is currently being covered by District.*

The course includes many topics such membership, running clubs, Rotary Foundation, projects, public relations and leadership. This information is covered in an interactive way with facilitated discussions. There can be about 12 - 15 participants at any one time.

This is a great opportunity not only to learn, but also to share your Rotary experiences with others.
