Sustainable Cambodia

Last Monday night Frank Ross provided an update on the Sustainable Cambodia project, a project which has been supported by our Club.

The project seeks to empower rural villagers to create self-sustaining communities with clean water, wells, ponds, pumps, biosand filters, latrines, preschool buildings, school furniture, libraries, school books and teaching aids.

The most recent grant application, to which we are a prospective party, will support over 500 families with hygiene and sanitation support, cows, buffaloes, rainwater harvesting, community ponds, latrines and wells, as well as associated training.
