Fundraising by recycling your eligible 10c containers.

How our supporters donate their containers using the fundraising barcode.

1. You must scan your unique barcode BEFORE returning eligible drink containers at their local Return and Earn Reverse Vending Machines. Can be done at ANY machine in NSW.

Message "Rotary" will appear on screen, then start feeding containers in.

2. When finished returning bottles and cans, select COLLECT on the touchscreen.

DO NOT select "Donate" A message should then appear that says "your funds will be transferred". 3. The refunds will be automatically transferred to our PayPal account.



Scan your barcode at the machine

They just need to scan the fundraising barcode. You can print and cut out this code if you wish or Norm has laminated ones.

You can also save to your I-Phone as a picture and use to scan.


