



I was born to a beautiful young couple from Durham & Thornaby on Tees in North Yorkshire, not long after World War 2. My parents were persuaded to emigrate to Australia for a “better life” by Dad’s best childhood mate, Don, who married an “Aussie lass” who followed him over to England on the HMS Victorious after they fell in love when Don was on leave in Sydney. They married in England and migrated to Australia.

The 3 of us set sail on the P&O SS *Mooltan* and arrived in Sydney early August 1950. I have a few little memories of the trip. For example: I threw my sunglasses overboard and told Mummy that the fishes needed them more than me. I celebrated my 3rd Birthday, (along with all the other Birthday children) on the boat. Hence my love for parties, no doubt.

I have a sister and two brothers (all Aussies). My parents and I were naturalised in 1988, our Bi-centenary year, to seal our love for having the opportunity to live in this wonderful country.

I attended St Mary’s Primary and High School, and The Metropolitan Business College. I worked in the “Legal World” until 1975 when I retired to have time at home with my son, David. The legal firm was a very hectic, exciting and busy Practice which specialised in Criminal, Matrimonial and Children’s Court matters.

In 1980 I had a total change, and we purchased the Springwood Garden Centre where I have worked ever since. A love of plants and opportunity allowed this to happen.

I have been involved with Community Work for many years now: the AOOB raising money mainly for the Children’s Hospital, The Winmalee Lioness Club, and finally The Rotary Club of Springwood in 1995. I was the first female member, being inducted in November 1995, thrown into the deep end in December as Community Director... I stayed on the Board, served in all avenues of service and became the first female President in 2005.

These days I still enjoy Rotary, though would like to assist more often. However, Peter and I have been married 20 years and enjoy our combined family of four boys, four beautiful daughters-in-law, seven grandchildren and one great grandchild. We are experiencing our Golden Years together making the most of everything.
