# Youth Committee - Cheryl Kitto



RYPEN - Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment - 14-16yr olds - Friday to Sunday program - generally runs twice a year – pending COVID restrictions – we hope to sponsor four students to attend.

RYLA - Rotary Youth Leadership Awards - 7-day program generally runs for a week in January in each. We hope to sponsor one student this year with the possibility of also sending a second special needs participant. Applications are due out shortly.

**Year 12 students** - Providing letters of encouragement to Year 12 students prior to them commencing their Yr 12 HSC exams.

**School Community Awards** – instead of providing money at the end of school



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year awards – create a community award for presentation at Rotary

Youth Mental Health - \$670 already provided to MYST to pay for booklets used in the Youth Mental Health First Aid program running in the Blue Mountains State High Schools – involving all year 10 students and a good number of teaching staff.

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#### Meet our members – Brownyn Berriman



I was born at Burwood, Sydney in November 1949 to my wonderful parents Lorna and Roy Crossman. For the first year of my life we lived with one set of my Grandparents in Concord and then moved to Epping, where our new home was being built, to live with my other Grandparents until our home was completed. Our modest home took nearly three years to complete and we moved in when was I three and it was my home until I was married.

At aged four my first brother arrived, another four years later and another four years after that, making me the eldest of four and only girl, which certainly had some advantages. Epping was a great place to grow up, almost semi-rural when we first moved in and big blocks with ours running down into the bush and finishing with Devlin's Creek as our back boundary. I went to Epping Heights Public School and then onto Cheltenham Girls High and completed the first Higher School Certificate there in 1967. By the time I had finished school I had already

been going out with Duncan for well over a year as we had met at a concert his band were playing at.

I started studying to become a teacher at Sydney Teachers College in 1968, the same year Duncan started teaching in Hay. During this time we became engaged. Duncan came back to Sydney at the end of 1969, I completed my teacher training at the end of 1970 and we were married on the 30th December 1970.

The first two schools I taught at were Riverstone High and Parramatta Selective school, both very different but lots of fun. In the Christmas holiday 1973/74 we went to the UK, which was my first overseas trip and I have loved travel both overseas and within Australia ever since. Upon our return the building of our house at Buena Vista Rd started and on the October long weekend 1974 we moved in with our 2week old son, Ben. We obviously loved it because here I am still.

Our family grew quickly with Tim born in 1976 and Belinda in 1978. I tell everyone that I married into Community Service Clubs as Duncan had joined APEX in Hay and transferred to Eastwood Club and was instrumental in restarting the APEX Club of Springwood when we moved here. Duncan went on to be on Club, Zone and National Board of APEX which saw our family taking two weeks holiday







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most years to travel to National Conferences all over Australia. This is how I also became involved in the Crest Club and I became a National Board Member and finally National President.

Duncan joined Springwood Rotary a couple of years after he finished with APEX and also after we had hosted our first two, of now about 24 I think, Rotary Exchange students. Having exchange students became a huge part of our lives as for so many years we had students stay with us. I became part of the District Youth Exchange Committee as a Counsellor for 7 years with Duncan heading up this program for a while. Two of our children went on exchange Tim to Denmark and Belinda to Belgium.

During all this time I continued teaching in Permanent Part Time positions at, Shalvey, MacArthur Girls at Parramatta, Blaxland and for 20 years at Bidwill, which though tough is still my favourite and without exception where I observed the best teaching being given. At the beginning of 2006 I moved to Kingswood High where Duncan was Deputy. Sadly in June 2006 Duncan died suddenly as the result of a heart attack. At this time my friends from, Rotary, Crest and in this community were just wonderful and I have never felt so cared for and supported. I immediately joined Rotary myself, a decision I have never regretted and I have held the positions of Club Secretary, Youth, Membership and now Club



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Administration and also the position of Secretary of the District Youth Exchange Committee.

Following a break from teaching after Duncan's death I took a job at Wycliffe Christian School which also provided me with many wonderful opportunities including travelling with year eleven students to Hong Kong and China and also to Bali with students to spend time in two wonderful orphanages at Meleya and Blimblinsari. I worked at Wycliffe for eight years and it was a great experience

During this time the other 'big event', that most or you are aware of, was losing my home in the 2013 bush fires. Once again Rotary, Crest, my friends, my Church and our wonderful Community groups like the Salvation Army all assisted in the most amazing, caring and compassionate way.

Sitting here writing this now in the family room of my seven-year-old home, looking out at the garden and beautiful bushland, retired and enjoying my nine grandchildren and life in general, despite Covid, I feel very fortunate for the life I've had and the people I've had in it.

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
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What is the Paul Harris Society?
