

# Meeting summary from Monday 1 November

It was truly wonderful to again be together at the Ori for our weekly meetings. And whilst the opportunity to freely chat among ourselves and enjoy a meal was fantastic; it was also surprising that it didn't feel too different to our weekly zoom meetings! The faces and conversations all felt very familiar due to the wonders of technology that have kept us connected over so many months.

President Jenny welcomed the members in attendance and noted how pleased she was to 'see us in the flesh'. Jenny spoke to the recent Bunning's BBQs and thanked the members who so willingly assisted on both days. Jenny noted the Christmas raffle is going well, but that she still had tickets for members to take and sell. Jenny also sought helpers for the selling of these raffle tickets between now and the draw.

Club Administration Director, Bronwyn noted the Club AGM will be held this coming week, 8 November at the Ori. The main rear dining room has been booked which allows for 32 attendees. Members who wish to attend should contact Peter Sparkes by either email or phone.

Secretary, Norm noted in reverence to COVID-19 restrictions members must wear facemasks within the Ori, with the only exception being when seated. The importance of full compliance with requirements was stipulated with this being for the protection of members and other patrons in the venue. Norm noted

that nominations for all Clubs' executive positions have now been received, but that further nominations can still be forwarded to him. The orders for the Gingerbread Houses have improved, with Norm still seeking a few more orders to meet our commitment of 80 units.

Community Service Director, Geoff

opened his report stating "it had been an exciting month doing nothing" (all those that know Geoff and his commitment to his portfolio know that he is always working hard at a number of projects for the Club – so 'doing nothing' is never on his agenda!) Geoff then confirmed the Norman Lindsay event now has sufficient volunteers to assist with parking and that Bill Bowler will be coordinating this event. Finally, Geoff noted that at this time it is not known if the Club will be assisting with late night Christmas shopping.

Treasurer, Bill remarked on the recent generous donation the Club had received from an Honorary Member and confirmed this had certainly improved the Club's finances. Bill then further spoke to the Norman Lindsay event previously mentioned by Geoff. Bill confirmed his development of a schedule for the event ensuring that it is both WHS & COVID-19 safe and compliant. Bill is also looking for volunteers to assist with parking on 4 December and will provide further details in the near future.

International Director, Frank stated he had received a letter of thanks from Destiny Rescue for the funds provided by the Club. Frank also took receipt of a Bronze Award from Shelter Box, noting the significant contribution the





Club had made in recent times.

Marilyn Kenny noted that Bronze

this very worthy project.
