Following are the criteria:

- Nominees can be club members, or community members who have provided distinctive service to the club or local community
- The awards are for recognition of effort and service in excess of what would normally be expected for their given role
- Nominations can relate to service in a specific event/project, or to service provision in general over a period of time
- Service provided must reflect the principles of the four-waytest
- All nominations are to be sent to me, and I will pass them on to the Committee.

Nominations must be made in writing and received no later than **Wednesday 11 May 2022**.

#### ShelterBox Aid Arrives in Ukraine

From District Governor's eNews Thanks to your generous donations, the first shipments of ShelterBox aid have arrived in Ukraine. Thousands of our mattresses have arrived in Ukraine, they will be distributed to collective centres in Lviv this week, offering people somewhere to sleep and keep warm at night. Bales of thermal blankets, pallets of Shelter Kits, solar lights and other essential items are on their way.

But our work doesn't stop there. We also have a team working in Moldova, where many people are fleeing from Ukraine. The team have been visiting collective centres and working to understand what people need.
